Monday 7<sup>th</sup> May

First part of these 24 hours fine weather took ship to the E.S.E. wind South by West saw a Embark and 2 Barks, whaling middle part the same latter under double Reef took ship to the S.W.

Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> May

First part of these 24 hours Strong winds from the S.E. spoke ship Sed. Studet St Johns and the Barks Proteas & Lockton of Sidney, at night under double Reef 2 sails middle part strong winds no alterations for the latter of ship in sight or Barks

Long by Chron. 161° 11 East Lat by Alt 25° 04 South  
Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> May

First part of these 24 hours Strong winds from the S.E. took ship to the N.E. under double Reef & sundown shortened sail 4 drops chasing Boigs in sight middle part and latter part no alterations under double Reef

Long by Chron. 160° 53 Lat 24° 56 South  
Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> May

First part of these 24 hours Strong winds from the E.S.E. steering to the South spoke Brig Sumner of Sidney 3 months out 150<sup>th</sup> Cap Phillip. at night lay under double Reef middle and latter part strong winds & sail in sight

Long by Chron. 159° 21 East Lat 25° 56 South  
Friday 11<sup>th</sup> May

First part of these 24 hours employed & various jobs spoke Bark Lady Blackwood of Sidney and Nicolas & 5 took in sail and wore ship to the N.E. middle and latter part the same no alterations in the weather

Long by Chron. 159° 33 East Lat 25° 39 South  
Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> May

First part of these 24 hours winds East by South variable in sight & night took in sail to the N.East. middle part more moderate latter wore ship to the South under single Reef spoke Bark Light of Sidney 6 months out 380<sup>th</sup>

Long by Chron. 159° 34 East Lat by Alt 25° 32 South

Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> May

First part of these 24 hours fine weather & 4 wore ship to the N.E. & sundown took in sail in company with the Light middle part fine latter part fine filled & one hundred & eighty off water for her & 9 wore ship to the South

Long 159° 36 East Lat by Alt 25° 22 South  
Monday 14<sup>th</sup> May

First part of these 24 hours fine in company with the Light & sundown took in sail middle part light air latter the same men employed in setting up main topmast rigging and other necessary jobs

Long by Chron. 159° 06 East Lat 26° 15 South  
Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> May

First part of these 24 hours light air from the east & sundown took in sail and wore ship to the N.E. 3 sail in sight middle and latter part calm men employed & various jobs such as setting awn making spun-yarn shoes tanning parchment &c

Long by my Distance 159° 59 by light 159° 57 East Chron. 159° 43 East Lat 26° 19  
Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> May

First part of these 24 hours fine weather steering to the East winds S.E. & sundown Downed kedge & 2 sail in sight middle part fine latter part fine Breeze from S.E. all sail out 1 Bk and 1 brig in sight men employed & various jobs

Lat by Alt 26° 14 S  
Long by my Distance 159° 25 East Long by light 159° 27 East Chron. 159° 16 East  
Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> May

First part of these 24 hours Strong winds from the E.S.E. steering to the N.E. & night took in sail light squalls of rain middle and latter part strong winds wore ship to the South saw Barches off the lower spoke Lighter Capt Cann onboard & 12 saw Barches

Long by Chron. D R 159° 20 Lat by Alt 25° 52  
1834 Friday 18<sup>th</sup> May

First part of these 24 hours Strong wind steering for the Barches & 3 saw a large pod Whale breved and meat and picked him to the west Boat & sundown came on board and took in sail middle part clear with strong Breeze & Daylight made sail and raised a large whale breved and struck him to the Bow Boat & took him along side
