

100 Remarks On Board Ship Dartmouth In The Pacific  
Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> August

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from S.E. laying S.W. & sundown under Doubled Reef to the South Middle part strong winds latter the M. Cannon in sight for 2 hours  
at 10 this day

Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> August

First part of these 24 hours fine with strong winds from the S.E. steering S by W & sundown tacked ship to the S.E. 3/4 starts bearing N.W. distant 25 miles  
Middle part strong winds tacked at 12 O'clock to the South latter part the same  
Long by Chron. 175° 31' West Lat by Obs 25° 18'

Monday 13<sup>th</sup> August

First part of these 24 hours more moderate made all sail to the South winds S.E. Middle part tacked ship to the E.S.E. winds S.W. latter strong winds 1 sail in sight watch employ in sending down Mizzen Top Sail yard being sprung and getting a new one  
Long by Lunar 175° 30' by Chron. 175° 30' West Lat 24° 15'

Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> August

First part of these 24 hours strong gale Southed Reefs Top Sails took in Mizzen Sail & sundown closed Reefs Reefs fore & main Top Sails halying by the Wind Middle part heavy swell ship heaving heavy was ship to the S.W. latter more ship to the E.S.E.  
Long by Chron. 174° 57' West Lat by Obs 24° 31' South

Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> August

First part of these 24 hours heavy swell from the South wind more moderate under Doubled reefs & sundown lay under short sail Middle part rough latter the same makes out after hatch put down 10th salt water to trim ship  
Long 174° 43'

Thursday 16<sup>th</sup>



1234 First part of these 24 hours more moderate finished after hole laying by the wind to the S.E. under Doubled Reefs Middle part from latter all sail set to the S.E. breaking out for heads & Reefs for tracks & g. raised as part of getting the Whales & 1/2 hours foreward all 4 boats went struck to the Starboard Boat and the Starboard Boat the Whales went to the Devil came on board and got Dinner  
Long by D. N. 174° 58' West Lat 24° 45'

Ocean Sperm Whaling Friday 17<sup>th</sup> August

1234 First part of these 24 hours plenty of Whales lowered all 4 boats and struck to the West Boat and parted with the top of 57 fathoms of line and one man slightly injured struck to the Bow Boat and cut with the top of some line boat badly stone was lost 2 men dangerously injured struck to the Starboard Boat with the top of line and boat Head struck to the Devil Larkson Boat struck with the top of line and Droggs all came on board without any hope took in sail for the night Middle part blowing strong & daylight closed Reefs main Top Sail took in fore Top Sail and fore sail blowing a gale saw a pod of Sperm Whales 4 ships length off Long by D. N. 174° 10' West Lat by Obs 25° 25'

Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> August

1234 First part of these 24 hours a gale from the S.W. laying S.E. Marcelline a native of the Cape De Verde died 20 minutes of 4 O'clock from the injury he received the day before in the boat and committed his body to the deep at 6 O'clock after a Prayer the ship laying to the S.W. by W Middle part heavy swell on a daylight from moderate made sail Doubled Reefs 3/4 main Top Sails  
Long by Chron. 174° 55' West Lat by Obs 25° 11'

Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> August

First part of these 24 hours heavy swell strong wind from the S.E. called a Manila line for the Starboard Boat & sundown took in sail to the S.W. Middle part rough latter more moderate under Doubled Reefs Top Sails  
Long by Chron. 175° 32' West Lat by Obs 25° 27' South

Monday 21<sup>st</sup>

First part of these 24 hours moderate & sundown took in sail to East middle part clear and into a daylight made sail on foreward fore repairing Bow Boat  
Long by Chron. 174° 52' West Lat 25° 30' South

Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup>

First part of these 24 hours under Doubled Reefs repairing Boat & sundown under two Top Sails to the East Middle part into and clear a daylight made all sail to the South winds & left repairing Boat at 10 this day

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
