

Remarks the Board Ship Dartmouth Sunday 9th Oct

First part of these 24 hours cut him in and cleared the decks and took in sail to the S.E. Middle parts came on to blow from the South took in fore sail and clear Masted Main Sd Sail at daylight more Ship to the west to rigging to Boil took up the Weather Boats

First part of these 24 hours a heavy sea with a gale from the South saw a right whale watch employed in cutting. Shoveled pieces to given to boil middle parts no alterations latter parts snow moderate commenced working still very rugged

Working at 4 o'clock were Ship to the S. East Middle parts more moderate at 5 o'clock coiled down made sail raised Whales lowered without success 2 sail in sight

First part of these 24 hours very light winds from the South saw Whales at sundown shortened sail to the Blackest West Middle parts fine at daylight made sail to the South saw 2 whales lowered without success

First part of these 24 hours fine weather all sail out saw 2 ship working and each with a whale after ship Hercules Kew Bedford Capt Finney 15 minutes at daylight 100 fms saw Whales lowered without success at sundown shortened sail middle parts calm at daylight made sail with light winds saw Whales at 9 o'clock and struck to the Bow Boat and parted the line struck another to the Starboard Boat and killed him took him alongside 2 sail in sight Whaling

First part of these 24 hours working Whales alongside more Ship to the South all hands busy setting up blocks and weighing middle parts cloudy with fresh breezes from the East middle latter parts the same

First part of these 24 hours began to cut a finished at sundown coiled down all hands employed in cooping winds from the North laying to the East saw Whales at 10 o'clock middle parts fine at daylight commenced working out Bow Boat for stowing down took up the ground tier and found them sound saw Whales toward 1 boat without success
