First part of these 24 hours fine Boiling stored down 7600 of W. Oil in night had to cold down for the want of Casks Middle part fine in daylight commenced stowing down stored down 10600 of W. Oil and started the works again wind W.S.W.

24 hours strong winds course South stowing down & sundown stored down 58000 Wright Whale and 3000 sperm Middle part cloudy latter part employed in breaking out Starboard side after holes for stowing down Lat 34° 53' S

Monday 19th Nov

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First part of these

24 hours finished stowing down 44000 W. Oil with this and after the first cut in off as the casks got down to be stored & sundown changed the decks over ship to the South wind S.E. and cloudy under that sail Middle part light winds latter part the same employed in Boiling ship
