sail out to the S.W. winds W.S.W. & sundown took in light sail
middle part light air latter all sail out with light winds from
the North were W.S.W. saw Blackfish

Wednesday 30 January

First part of these 24 hours fine still
with a little rain winds all around the compass & sundown taken
middle part strong winds from the S.W. latter part took in fore & main

the S.W. by W took in fore sail & main & fore sail took in
any sail from fore & main stay sail & fore sail to the S.W. & main employed in

few days & sundown shortened sail with fine weather no land in sight

Monday 4th

First part of these 24 hours light winds from
the S.W. by W & night doubled Reef the Top Sail thick to windward
Cape Horn bearing West distant about 2° middle part strong winds with
rain latter part 1 sail in sight steering S.E. wind S.W. steering to the S.W. by W
Long by Lunar 175° 22' E by Obs 174° 22' East Lat by Obs 35° 03'

Tuesday 5th

First part of these 24 hours very light
air & sundown taken in sail in hopes the wind will be lost
middle part fine winds from the S.E. & latter part light winds from the South
Long by Obs 173° 32' East by Lunar 175° 24' E Lat by Obs 34° 54' S

Wednesday 6th

First part of these 24 hours light air
from the South & 1 O'clock saw Cape Horn bearing S.W. by S distant
about 25 miles there fore from cabin saw from heights bearing S by E & sundown
light air from the W by S steering in for the Cape middle part almost calm
latter part light winds from the South & North steering in for the Cape makes with
a round Whiff at the part stood in until it bore West got a set of altitudes & mile
of the land gave the long by Obs 174° 40' East Lat 34° 00'
