

Occurrences On Board Ship Dartmouth

Monday 20th May 1839

First part of their 24 hours fine weather with light winds from the S.W. by E. Middle & latter parts strong winds from the N.E. by E. by E.
Long by Obs 155° 08' W Lat 5° 58' S

Tuesday 21 May

First part of their 24 hours strong winds by E. mate employed in repairing etc. Boat Middle parts strong winds latter saw a breach all sail out to the S.W.
Long by Obs 154° 51' W Lat 7° 27' S

Wednesday 22nd

First part of their 24 hours fine strong S.W. by E. all sail out Middle and latter parts fine with light winds
Long by Obs 154° 36' W by Sun 154° 08' Lat 8° 33' S

Thursday 23

First part of their 24 hours fine strong down 18th Spear Oil with light winds from S.W. by E. Middle and latter parts fine weather all sail out to the South
Long by Obs 165° 09' W by Sun 165° 59' Lat 9° 27' S

Friday 24th

First part of their 24 hours fine all sail out to the S.W. Middle and latter parts the same
Long by Obs 166° 13' W Lat by Obs 10° 33' S

Saturday 25th

First part of their 24 hours fine weather all sail out to the South wind East Middle parts took in 3/4 of ship latter all sail out to the S.W. 21 saw 13 Breaches
Lat 10° 33'

Sunday 26th

First part of their 24 hours lowered all 4 boats and struck to the Starboard Boat and took him alongside and cut him in a 6 wire net and made sail to the South Middle parts cut the blubber into horse pieces latter parts employed in Working
Long by Obs 167° 56' W Lat by Obs 12° 29' S

Monday 27th

First part Working under Topails to the South Middle parts finished Working latter aboard the deck and water off
Long by Obs 168° 18' Lat by Sun 14° 00'

On the South Pacific Ocean

Tuesday 28 May 1839

First part of their 24 hours down in light & sundown double Topails 4 miles from the small Bl. to the N.E. Middle parts laying off latter ran down to the weather of 3 miles
Long by Obs 170° 14' W Lat by Obs 14° 14' S

Wednesday 29th

First part of their 24 hours strong under double Topails laying S.W. Tutuila bearing N.W. & sundown distant 10 miles Middle parts the same latter running down and the long of S
Lat 14° 23'

Thursday 30th

First part of their 24 hours strong winds laying off & on & the cor combs Middle parts laying off latter part stood in light at home strong wind and rugg
Friday 31st May

First part of their 24 hours in shore & sundown boat came on board and stood off under South's keep. Middle parts the same latter were ship in shore
Long by Obs 169° 46' W Lat by Obs 14° 00'

Saturday 1st June 1839

First part of their 24 hours in under the land & sundown shortened sail heading off shore 1 sail in light Middle parts backed in shore spoke the Governor Capt. Mayhew got 1500 lb
Sunday 2nd June

First part of their 24 hours strong winds spoke the Emory Morgan Capt. Clark of W. Bedford & Montague 600 lb Working a small Whaler & sundown stood off shore Middle parts equally latter parts saw Whaler landed in company with the M. & C. M. and took 1 to the Starboard Boat & 1 to the White Boat
Monday 3rd June

First part of their 24 hours hoisted over Whaler in Mow & showed the decks the E.M. got 3 the M. 1 & 2 sundown inshore Middle parts heavy rain latter cloudy morning Working standing in shore canvas came off we got some coconuts the E.M. Working the wind and nothing done from Whaler
