

Remarks On Board Ship Dartmouth
Tuesday 4th June

First part of the 24 hours had a heavy squall of the land intermixed with rain which blew our jib in ribbons and had to cool down a 4 moderate with fair weather and sundown finished turned up 5 fathoms of sperm oil out of 2 whale. Latter part fair weather under the lee of Pataclah

Wednesday 5th June

First part of the 24 hours fair all sail out strong trades spoke the Harriot of London. Capt Baker Middle & latter parts strong trades running down to Ofolo

Thursday 6th June

First part of the 24 hours lying off & on to the S.E. end of Ofolo 3 sail in sight a night lying off under short sail middle part rainy, latter part came N.W. under that sail Lat 14° 19' S

Friday 7th June

First part running in to the bar end of Ofolo a night hauled off to the South under double reef Survey South & Quarring West about 18 miles off middle part and latter strong winds

Saturday 8th June

First part of the 24 hours under the lee of Survey & this in sight a sundown came double reef. Top sails middle part light air from the East lying South Lexington Working latter part light air 4 ships in sight

Sunday 9th

First part of the 24 hours Calm the 2 the Monitor & 8 Morgan in show of us 1 from ship a sundown 8 miles off shore current setting us up towards Ofolo middle and latter parts fair

Monday 10th

First part of the 24 hours fair weather middle & latter parts the same with light air in company with the 2 and C.M. lying along shore

Tuesday 11th

First part of the 24 hours light air in company with the 2 ships middle and latter parts the same & this in sight

Wednesday 12th

First part of the 24 hours fair calm in company with the Wiscasset of Wiscasset. 16 months out 600 sperm 600 right whale middle & latter parts light air

Thursday 13th

First part of the 24 hours fair fair trades under the lee of the Island 2 ships in sight middle and latter parts the same all sail out

Friday 14th

1st Ship John Howland First part of the 24 hours fair weather all sail out taking off and on middle part & latter parts the same Long 172° 17' Lat 13 45

Saturday 15th

2nd Ship John Howland First part of the 24 hours fair brought yams & there gaming with the 2 & C.M. saw a brood of those of us middle and latter parts 4 ships in sight nothing remarkable Long 172° 29 Lat 13 40

Sunday 16th

First part of the 24 hours fair weather with Calm most of the time a wind double reef middle part good breeze lying S by E latter parts the same rising heavy

Monday 17th

First part of the 24 hours strong winds and thick weather under double reef. Main top sail to the 9 land Quarring North 1 sail in sight middle and latter parts rainy under double reef. In sight

Tuesday 18th

First part of the 24 hours sailing with heavy squalls from the E. & S. lying South under Main top sail double reef and 2000 Spencer middle part and latter rising thick weather

Wednesday 19th

First part of the 24 hours strong squally weather a sundown set cloud reef. Fore top sail and main ship to the 2 & C.M. middle part strong winds and a heavy sea faster Main top mast back strong latter parts more ship in the Long by the 173° 27 West Lat 15° 03 S
