

Remarks On Board Ship Dartmouth Thursday 20th June

First part of the 24 hours
heading S. by E. under double reef squally weather middle and
latter part clear all sail out Long by Chr 173° 12' W Lat 13° 58'

Friday 21st June

First part of the 24 hours
all sail out to the S. E. middle fine & clear & daylight under
the land off white house & off shore got boats ready and went working.

Saturday 22nd June Long 172° 39'

First part of the 24 hours fine got
off & back of wind and stood off middle and latter part fine saw grasshoppers

Sunday 23rd

First part of the 24 hours
squally, spoke Mercator & sundown took down main & mast. Much
stays middle part and latter fine saw the chariot of Mars 6 months
out clear.

Monday 24th

First part of the 24 hours got over
back stay over mast head and heavy squall with rain the lightning
to leeward whaling and the chariot whaler middle and latter part
fine weather thick & E. did not get East

Lat 13° 23'

Tuesday 25th

First part of the 24 hours fine
all sail out the land 4 miles off spoke L & sundown took in sail
middle and latter part fine weather almost calm

Long by Chr 172° 34' W Lat 13° 26'

Wednesday 26th

First part of the 24 hours fine
weather all sail out & ships in sight spoke Mercator middle part fine
latter all sail out saw black fish several & took without success the chariot
boats down spoke M. & Alby and got mechanically new from Gloucester
first I have had for long time got altitude White House bearing S. E. 9 4 miles.

Long by Chr 172° 37' W Lat 13° 27'

Thursday 27th June

First part of the 24 hours good
weather & sundown double reef taking off shore middle and latter part
calm got altitude White House bearing S. E. by E. distant 5 miles
Long by Chr 172° 38' W Lat 13° 28'

In the South Pacific Ocean Friday 28th June

First part of the 24 hours calm and
strong winds sent the boat on shore for the Capt & sundown & mile
of the land middle part calm daylight raised, whale lowered and
chased them about 6 miles in company with the Micaunt & Chariot within 1/2

Long by Chr 172° 35' West White House S. E. distant 8 miles

Saturday 29th June

First part of the 24 hours fine
no boat came & sundown no tidings almost calm land 5 miles off
middle and latter part calm repairing jibs jugs and other rigging

Sunday 30th

First part of the 24 hours strong wind
blowing along the land filling rigging & sundown shortened sail and spoke
middle part tacking out South & daylight split fore top sail sent it
down repaired it and bent it fast to jib boom masting all guy and the jib
basting all guy.

Monday 1st July 1839

First part of the 24 hours steering in for
the sea of success with a strong wind under double reef & sundown
light winds middle & latter part the same bearing 13 S. E. E.

Lat by D R 13° 45'

Tuesday 2nd July

First part of the 24 hours
steering in for shore & 5 spoke Mercator & sundown fine weather
under double reef middle part light air latter good breeze heading for land
& lowered standard about 6 ft. west on shore.

Wednesday 3rd July

First part of the 24 hours fine
keeping off & on middle part off latter stood in shore

Long by Chr 172° 40'

Thursday 4th July

First part of the 24 hours fine
weather boat came off with jugs & sundown standing offshore middle
and latter part light air fine all quarters & sail in sight
killed a pig and had him for dinner
