

Remarks On Board Ship Dartmouth

Friday 19th July 1839

The first part of these 24 hours fine all sail out & 6 some ship to the S.E. Middle part daylight sails latter part calm in company with the party of Sydney

Long by Chs 171° 42' Lat by Chs 14° 41'

Saturday 20th

The greatest pleasure I have First part of these 24 hours calm & 6 both light winds from the South laying 6 by S. Middle part fine latter the same laying 6 by the S.E. & 6

Lat by Lat 14° 15'

Sunday 21st

since I cannot enjoy your society First part of these 24 hours fine weather all sail out employed in repairing spanker Bataclah bearing S by S distant 18 miles Middle and latter parts beating up to the Island

Lat 14° 10' S

Monday 22

First part of these 24 hours fine weather all sail out & sundown 6 point bearing E. S. & 6 distant 18 miles Middle part laying off and on & daylight stood in and went in with the boat and sounded out our anchorage in our harbor & 9 came too anchor in 18 fathoms and shifted the sails Long by Chs 170° 49' West

Sunday 23rd July

getting of wood &c First part of these 24 hours continued getting of wood &c Long by Chs 170° 22' West

Wednesday 24 July

getting off Wood and shore waiting for the present time & 6 Long by Chs for each day & anchor

24th 170° 27' 25th 170° 31' 26th 170° 30' 27th 170° 24' 28th 170° 27' 29th 170° 24' 30th 170° 28'

Thursday 1st August

First part of these 24 hours took our anchor and stood off and lashed our anchors a strong wind from the S.E. at 4 o'clock Reel the top sail standing to the S.E. Middle part strong wind latter part in shore off the boat Combs

In the South Seas

Friday 2 August 1839

First part of these 24 hours left over the Pung Pung ship laying off & on 1 M to sundown Middle laying off and on latter part the same with light wind from the S.E. & 6

Saturday 3 August

First part of these 24 hours calm sent the boat in got handy in with the ship and had to tow her off at sundown light air from the S.E. & 6 laying 6 by S. Middle part wind to the S.E. & 6 rainy with heavy squalls all the latter part ran round on the South side the Island in company with the Wisconsin

Sunday 4th

First part of these 24 hours squally with rain all kinds of weather Middle and latter part the same laying off and on

Monday 5th

First part of these 24 hours all kinds of weather boat came on board laying off & on fine fair weather from the Middle part rainy latter more fine all sail out beating up to the shore sent boat on shore for our 2 menaways but without success

Tuesday 6th

First part of these 24 hours fine took a long boat in tow for Pung Pung in distress Middle and latter part the same sent boat for top Gallant sail and Jolly Lib

Wednesday 7th

First part of these 24 hours fine weather all sail out wind South laying off the land Middle part same latter most in with the boat for the men without success

Lat 14° 09' S Long by Chs 170° 25'

Thursday 8th August

First part of these 24 hours fine weather laying off and on & sundown took our last barrell of Bataclah for Opole under top sail Middle part parted by the wind latter ran down to the boat side of Opole and ship & 6 men employed in repairing top Bree sail and repairing 8 Boat fine Trade & 6 ends these 24 hours

Lat 14° 09' S Long by Chs 170° 25'
