

Remarks On Board Ship Dartmouth Iron

Friday 14th February 1841

First part of them 24 hours every set with fine pleasant weather wind that course at E by N Middle and latter part calm latter strong wind from N.W. all sail out clear weather

Long by Chr 50° 00' Lat 55° 57'

Saturday 15th

First part of them 24 hours fine pleasant weather 4000 lbs 2000 lbs oil Middle and latter part calm and thick with rain in company with the China

Long 56° 50' Lat 55° 27'

Sunday 16th

First part of them 24 hours thick night with wind and thick Middle part thick and calm latter part light winds from the S.W. course W by E

Long by Chr 53° 37' Lat 55° 13'

Monday 17th

First part strong winds from the N.W. all sail out that the Spanker the C in company with the China and latter part strong winds from the West all sail out

Long by Chr 52° 37' Lat 52° 12'

Tuesday 18th

First part of them 24 hours gaming with the C all sail out course N.W. fine and pleasant Middle part fresh wind from the W.S.W. with squally latter part same

Long by Chr 51° 00' Lat 49° 27'

Wednesday 19th

First part fresh gale from the S.W. every thing set worn at the China along with North pump adding Middle and latter part light air from the N.W. fine and pleasant

Long by Chr 48° 32' Lat 45° 14'

Thursday 20th

First part pleasant and light air from the S.W. all sail out Middle and latter part same good night when going

Friday 21st

First part light winds Middle and latter cloudy strong wind from the N.W. by N all sail out course N.E. by N the China saw a large bright whale Middle and latter part light air from the N.W.

Long by Chr 45° 55' Lat 42° 00'

Cape Horn to (Cape Bedford)

Saturday 22nd February

First part of them 24 hours calm with light air from the N Middle and latter part light air from the N.W. by N with plenty of Sinker and Wright Whale birds high ground

Long by Chr 44° 29' Lat 43° 53' South

Sunday 23rd

First part of them 24 hours fine pleasant weather all sail out wind N.W. by N. latter part light air from the N.W. by N all sail out

Long by Chr 42° 55' Lat 41° 55' Lat 42° 19' S

Monday 24th

First part of them 24 hours very strong wind from the N.W. by N. all sail out in company with the China laying to the N.E. plenty of Sinker and Wright Whale birds high ground

Tuesday 25th

First part set S. ship S. sails course N.E. thick and rainy Middle part from moderate latter made all sail wind N.W. wind prevail from N.W. to N.E. by N all sail out

Wednesday 26th

First part of them 24 hours fine and clear with a strong wind from the N.W. course N.E. Middle part thick in Sinker and Wright Whale birds high ground

Long by Chr 33° 35' Lat 34° 16' Lat 37° 35'

Thursday 27th

First part of them 24 hours strong winds from the N.W. by N. course N.E. by N all sail out in company with the China under our stern Middle and latter part moderate all sail out course N.E. by N

Friday 28th

First part of them 24 hours fine with light air and calm Middle and latter part calm and light air from the N.W. by N all sail out in company with the China

Long by Chr 32° 15' Lat 34° 50'
