Thursday March 28<sup>th</sup> 1867

Commenced with fine clear weather at sunset  
took in sail heading W latter light breezes  
employed in breaking out must be.

Remarks on board Friday March 29<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with fine weather still employed  
in breaking out the after hole it after the  
same at sunset took in sail heading S. E.

Remarks on board Saturday March 30<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with a strong breeze from the S. E.  
at sunset took in the foresail and abore reefed  
the main topsail latter strong breeze with  
sun employed in breaking out water

Remarks on board Sunday March 31<sup>st</sup>

Commenced with fine weather heading S. W  
with all sail out latter at sunset doubled reefed  
the topsails. Middle part fine weather later the  
same at 10 o'clock saw black fish towered away  
and got too to the Starboard boat

Monday March 1<sup>st</sup> Commenced with fine weather  
employed in cutting black fish finished  
about 9 p m five men got in to a gizzard about  
7 o'clock much cut in a fight but the first mate  
been reported from at sun got took in sail heading  
east

Remarks on board April 1<sup>st</sup>

Commenced with fine weather heading S. E  
with all sail out employed in boiling out  
black fish later the same at sunset took in  
sail

Tuesday April 2<sup>nd</sup> commenced with fine weather  
wind S. W steering S. with all sail out  
employed in mending foretop gallant sail  
later the same at sunset luffed to the wind  
and took in sail. Lat 33. 37 S

Wednesday April 3<sup>rd</sup> commenced with weather wind  
S. E at sunrise made sail and kept her away  
employed in mending sail later the same  
with light breeze at 4 o'clock P. M. luffed to  
the wind on the starboard tack at sunset took  
in and wore ship

Thursday April 4<sup>th</sup> commenced with a strong breeze  
from the S. E. at 10 o'clock luffed to on the starboard tack  
employed in breaking out water at sunset took  
the foretop sail and abore reefed the main

Friday April 5<sup>th</sup> commenced with thick fog and  
rain and continued so throughout the day

from the W. S. W. at daylight luffed the cap out

to the westward with fine weather at sunset doubled  
reefed the topsails furled gill and main sail
