

Pass. Cordemona Off Rodriguez Cruising

Sunday April 21st Commenced with strong winds and squally weather at 2 A.M. were ship to the south day light more moderate at 9. were ship to the south latter part strong winds with squalls Log 14.58 1/2

Monday April 22nd Commenced with strong winds heading to the east at daylight made the land bearing East S.W. about 12 passed the end of the reef showed up the cables and went stem at 5 P.M. ahead of the harbor were ship off shore and took in sail

Tuesday April 23rd Strong winds at 2 P.M. were ship in shore daylight stood off wind increasing pulled the foretop sail latter the same with strong breezes at 6 P.M. close reefed main topsail Log 18.21

Wednesday April 24th Blowing a gale from the S.E. laying under close reefed main topsail and fore sail at 4 P.M. held away West Log 19.14 1/2

Thursday April 25th Fresh breeze from the N.E. at daylight made the land bearing S.E. Employed in washing out water latter part strong breezes at 4 last sail abiding for the land

Friday April 26th Commenced with strong winds from the S.E. at daylight made the land at 8 took a pilot and came to anchor ship China baying off and on Capt ashore. Later employed in getting water casks ready to send shore

Saturday April 27th Employed in stowing water One waterman on liberty at sunset he came aboard China sailed for Manilla to night

Remarks On Board Cordemona Off Rodriguez

Sunday April 28th Commenced with fine weather one watch ashore on liberty at sunset came aboard later light breeze and fine weather

Monday April 29th Commenced with light winds with rain squalls employed in cleaning iron work one watch went ashore on liberty at sunset all came aboard saw ship off the harbor at sunset

Tuesday April 30th Light winds and fine weather employed in getting water and wood and stowing it below Bulk stinkow came to an anchor to the south with 600 lbs whale 250 sperm

Wednesday May 1st fine weather employed in stowing off the hatches cleaning up decks

Thursday May 2nd fine weather at 3 P.M. pilot came aboard took on anchor and proceeded to sea stowed away cables and cleared up decks at 7 doubled reefed the topsails later fine and light breeze

Friday May 3rd Commenced with fine weather employed in getting boats ready for working later fine weather and light breezes at sunset took in sail land bearing east distant 30 miles

Saturday May 4th fine weather and light breeze employed in washing ship at sunset land bearing east distant 10 miles kept her away west at 10 hauled to the south

Sunday May 5th fine weather and light breeze land distant about 20 miles

Monday May 6th Commenced with fine weather and light breeze from the S.E. employed in the rigging
