Tuesday August 29. 1876.

Came with light Wind, up for Fayal at 10 A.M. Capt Vincent went on shore and took the Officer Mr Stuart down is sick to see the Doctor. The Boat came back with Potatoes and Canned at 5 P.M. Capt stayed on shore. employed on Board finishing Citing

Wednesday 30th

Commenced with fine Weather, the later part some Rain at daylight sent the Boat after Capt Vincent. the Boat came back at 1 P.M. Mr Stuart stayed on shore also some Recruits the Wheel bound to the Westert.

Thursday 31st

Came with light airs. breaking out for Water and Provisions saw one Bark Stearing by the wind

Friday September 1st

Have fresh Breeze and some Rain Stearing to the N. Pico in sight bearing N.E. employed stowing down our Oil and some other jobs.

Came with strong Breeze noting in sight. employed on the Rigging and some other jobs

Sunday 3rd

Have had a Pleasant Day saw one Whaling Bark under short Sails at Flores on the Water beam Ship Stearing to the N.

Monday September 4th

Came with strong Breeze saw some Grampasias and one Seal moderated at noon employed breaking out for Wood and the Noon and some other jobs Land in sight
Lat 39. 45

Tuesday

5th Came with strong wind and calms at sunset Stearing for Flores on Ship in distance. breaking out for Wood and employed on several jobs

Wednesday 6th

Have light airs and calms Ship abreast St. Cruz Cap Vincent went on shore after Recruits and came back at 7 P.M. with Potatoes and Vegetables and one live Bulluck and so on employed on board breaking out for Water and taking care of the Provision.

Thursday 7th

Came with calms abreast of the John H. Brown had one visit from the English Consul taking care of the Recruits and killing the Bulluck making 249. to one Ship in sight

Friday 8th

Commenced with light Wind, past a number of Ships Ship to the S.E. employed on several jobs.

Saturday 9th

Have pleasant weather Land in sight also some Vessels Stearing to the S. employed on several jobs
