Tuesday 13th

Commenced to Moderate some Rain
Ship Boiling one sail in sight towards mostly
barks and plenty Rain blantly breaking
out for Water.

Have a variable Day with Squalls and
Rain Strong Breeze from the S. Ship head-
ing to the S. S.W. finish Boiling and
clearing the Deck.

no sights.

Thursday 15th

Some Squally with some Rain Ship heading
S.E. nothing in sight Steaming Down our side
some of our Men are Sick

Friday 16

Have in the Morning Strong Wind and
Rain the latter part Moderate Ship
steering by the Wind heading N. employed
on several jobs breaking out for Water

Commenced pleasant Light Breeze from the
S.W. Ship Cruising on several Tacks
one sail in sight also with Water employed
Washing Ship

Have a light Breeze from the S.W. Ship
steering S.W. by N. one sail in sight also
some Sprouts

N.W. Ship steering E. N.E. nothing in sight
employed repairing the fore Gallard Sail
and breaking out for Beef and Pork
