June 24th

Pleasant and moderate breeze from the W. heading N.W. one vessel in sight, employed, running, rigging, wet, broke & go. Gible & fly with Kalyards Perle lashing to the topsail yard & gallant yard etc. J. Gallant runner, Kalyards and Braces. J. Gallant Braces etc. Spencer yards and Spenceer guys at sunset. Shortened sail No and J. port light breezes bent - etc. Spencer.

June 25th

Pleasant and light breezes from the W. heading N.W. one vessel in sight shortened sail at sunset - No and J. port echm employees in repairing sails got the sail etc. J. Gallant - topsail and J. Spenceer

Pleasant and very light winds from the W. heading N.W. saw lots of forgers two ships in sight took up, high sails heading N.W. etc and J. port fresh breeze

Cloudy weather and fresh breeze from the W. heading N.W. picked up a large stick of timber slope Barb - taken three bags out - 140 lbs. at 7 p.m. exchanged. William Jones Cooper for Jonas Casanova same - most - hand etc and J. port fresh breeze several junks in sight - returned - broken to most - topsail

Pleasant and fresh breeze from the W. heading N.W. picked up a p.m. breeze for blackfish no access No and J. port strong breeze from the W. heading N.W. several merchant ships in sight
