August 25th

Overcast weather with fresh breeze from the W. wind heading S.W. all sail 3 pm took in light sails 6 pm reefed the S. T. sail and vessel in sight of land. S. part strong breeze and rough heading S.W. by under double reef T. sail and vessel to be kept going

August 26th

no obs

Squally weather wind W. S.W. to W. at 4 pm strong with rain ship under short sail at part the same S. part wind abate the compass and rain in torrents thunder and lightning under short sail Bar down 29.07 safe going

August 27th

no obs

Rain in torrents fine abate the compass under short sail two vessels in sight - Bar 29.67 the part fresh breeze from the W. wind with much rain steering W. by S. part pleasant with ignoble W. wind engls with fresh breeze from S.W. heading S.W. to be the same

Squally from the W. wind from S.W. at 4 pm two vessels in sight Barometer low 29.06 pumping three times in twenty four hours at part light breeze from S.W. to S. steering W. by S. part strong breeze from S.W. with overcast weather four vessels in sight employed in various things about the ship passed a English Brigg 800 m exchange longitude Manual Benard off duty with the Surge

August 29th

Heavy rain weather strong breeze from the S. steering W. by S. 2 pm took in light sails 4 pm reefed the T. sails at part overcast and strong breeze S. part pleasant and fresh breeze all sail set heading W. wind employed looking down to work and various other things
