

June Continued Round to Is. of Prince

Wednesday 22nd This day strong S.W. winds steering from N.E. to North. Employed in mending the ship to the leeward then for prizes. Picked over our potatoes again. Land went out of sight at one P.M. At 4 P.M. furled the light sails, luffed to the wind with head yard aback. At 12 M. tacked ship & layed aback on the other tack. At 5 AM tacked again & kept her off N.E. At 6 AM saw two rocks called the two Brothers one point on our weather bow dist eight miles. At eight saw the Island right ahead. Steered for it as well as we could at 12 coming down the land. So ends.

Thursday 24th This day strong S.W. winds from S.W. running down the land. Called Prince Island at 2 P.M. Set on the anchor in 14 fathoms water. Had the two Port guns tanned. The ship for one hour. Latter part calm. At daylight called all hands & hoisted anchor & put two boats ahead & towed in shore to our anchorage in eight fathoms water. Employed in getting up the head rigging & hauling the ship to point the Starboard head. So ends.

Friday 25th Civil time. This day weather good had men to mast. Saw two whale off shore but did not lower for them. Going quick saw them but they rising. Capt. went a little way from the ship & tried to catch some fish. Some canoes came along side the frigate. Latter part went to S.W. bay. Carried the Starboard boat on shore to point. So ends. Second mate off duty.

Laying to anchor at Prince Island

Saturday June 26th Fresh N.W. winds. Employed in painting Starboard boat & the Starboard side of the ship. At 12 M. went below on account of sickness. Second mate still off duty. Capt. went in the fore-castle & found some five or six casks of lead.

Sunday 27th This day good breeze out side. Several men from shore came on board. Capt. traded for some soap & one self for a Parrot. At 20th 4th M. saw two Whales. Capt. & this mate lowered but could not strike. came on board at lamplight. The two first officers sick & off duty. So ends.

Monday 28th This day strong wind one boat off cruising. repainted the port side & also the bottom of the Starboard boat. The old man rather unwell himself not much better but the second mate some better of his fever.

Tuesday 29th To day strong S.W. winds two boats off cruise. Capt. still sick. Second mate better so that he went in his boat. The steward sick & my self not much better but so as to be up around. Last night at 7 gave the vessel 5 fathoms man chain. At sun down came on board have seen nothing but porpoises. Mr. Phillips employed in point top of the rail & plank shire. So ends.

Wednesday 30th To day strong S.W. winds have seen nothing but porpoises. Had two boats off on a cruise. Employed on board in painting the Starboard boat on the in side we brought her off this morning at daylight. At sundown came on board to supper. So ends.
