

Remarks on board Schr  
 March Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> This twenty four  
 hours commenced with a good breeze  
 from the S. E. steering N. E. by N.  
 the North. At sundown furled the  
 main & fore sail & set the topsails  
 steered S. E. by E. At 11 through  
 the middle weather the same  
 with the wind South. Steered  
 S. by E under all sail. At 12  
 Latitude 14° 20'  
 Long 9° 16'

Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> This twenty four  
 hours commenced with a strong  
 breeze from the S. W. steered  
 S. by South until 10 when luff  
 ed up to S. E. by E. S. Sun  
 compass & a very heavy swell  
 setting from the S. W.  
 At 11 steered the right. Steered  
 S. by South. Steered whole watches  
 Sun compass. Steered the same  
 At 12 Lat 73° 00' Long 113° 00'  
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 At 12 Lat 73° 00' Long 113° 00'

Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> This day opening with  
 quite moderate breeze steered  
 East. At 3 P.M. raised land  
 bearing S. E. distant about  
 10 miles. At sundown furled  
 the main sail. Cape Martha  
 bearing at seven S. E. luffed up  
 N. E. by N. middle part steered  
 N. E. by N. North. At 3 hauled

 Thursday continued 17<sup>th</sup>  
 it being moderate & thick. At  
 daylight steered down the land and  
 spoke a nigger boat trading in  
 in other words nigger trading boat  
 last distant 5 miles. At 12 P.M.  
 Cape Mary distant seven miles  
 Lat Lat 12° 11'

Friday 18<sup>th</sup> This twenty four hours opening  
 with very light air. Spoke all points  
 trying to work down the land. Sun  
 compass & a nigger boat  
 employed in running. At 12 P.M.  
 three crabs of water. Middle part  
 good breeze steering down the land  
 for elephant road at 9 P.M. hauled  
 off shore & on in the morning wind  
 all left at 10 P.M. had a breeze & spring  
 up from the South. Putting out  
 sing ground all the time. Lowered  
 out boat & pulled in shore for  
 information. Came off at 12 P.M. and  
 got the sun from our line  
 Saturday one degree to the West

Saturday 19<sup>th</sup>  
 This twenty four hours opening with  
 very fine weather with Northerly  
 wind, beating down the land.  
 at 2 P.M. got a sight found our  
 Cron 50° 00' West. At 12 minutes  
 to four had a breeze springing up from  
 the westward & ran down the  
 the bay & the wind left us. Lowered all  
 three sails & pulled her in to  
 10 fathom water. Let go anchor.
