

Saturday April 2nd This twenty four hours commences with good breeze from S.E. Steering W. N. W. Day pumps. At sundown furled the mainsail & set the main topsail middle the dome. At 8 P.M. raised land bearing West dist about 18 miles Steered for it. At nine lowered a boat Capt went on shore. At 12 came off reports eight whalmen at anchor. Do ends.

Sunday 3rd This day opens with good breeze from S.E. working in to the harbor of St. Helena. At 4 P.M. in 10 fathoms water furled the sails & cleared up the deck. Sunday morn weather fine after breakfast sent one watch on shore for six hours day ends the same.

Monday 4th This twenty four hours opens with very fine weather middle the dome. This morning found one man named French I had left during the night. The Chir sailed on a cruise. This morning employed in tarring the head gear & scrubbing the main-topmast. Do ends.

Tuesday 5th This day opens with good weather. Received from W. Freeman 112 gallons of molasses & 2 casks of sugar. Middle part quite good breeze from the S.E. Scatter the same. Two whalmen sailed from this port.

Wednesday 6th

This twenty four hours opens with quite good weather middle the dome. Employed in tarring the head gear. Do ends. Capt's wife quite sick.

Thursday 7th

This day sea account weather good. Employed in setting up the fore stay. One man went on shore during the night against my orders but the police came aboard with him this morning. Capt's wife quite sick.

Friday 8th

At St. Helena. This morning day weather good employed in painting the bands & mending the gaff-top-sail. At 10 P.M. sent the gaff-top-sail & do ends. This day Friday civil account April 8th J. J. Robinson was called before the American Consul & accused by one man of ill treatment towards him. Steward Patrick Clark a negro, & the Consul settled it & told him to go on board & do his duty or go to jail. In the presence of my self & Capt. Williamson.

Saturday 9th

This day opens with good weather. Employed in putting on a main-stick cleat & setting up the fore-topmast rigging & mending the fore-sail. Do ends.

Sunday 10th

This day weather fine middle the dome. At 10 P.M. sent the men forward on shore on 24 hours liberty excepting two men forward & ends.
