May Thursday 5th / 840

This twenty four hours the first part steering N.E. & E. with wind from N.W. At sundown furl'd the mainsail & sat the fore sail middle the same. After the same only had the mainsail on her and parpoises & got one or two ends
Lat 7.00 & Long 6.10

Friday 6th This day opens with wind S.W. steering by the wind heading S.E. & E. Employed in making a run for the main-boom when left at four P.M. furl'd the mainsail middle the same. At seven sat the mainsail Steered S.E. by E. & ends
Lat 6.40 & Long 7.40 E

Saturday 7th This day opens with strong breeze steering N.E. by E. wind S.W. At sundown furl'd the mainsail Employed in ripping up the old fore sail. Saw porpoises middle the same. Leather under all sail heading S.E. by E. & ends. Saw five porpoises

Sunday 8th This day fine light breeze steering S.E. by E. Low finbacks middle the same. At 10 P.M. tacked ship. At nine kept her off by N.W. under all sail. Saw finbacks. & ends

Monday 9th This day opens with a good fine breeze from S.W. Steered N.W. At 3 P.M. wore ship. Steered E. At sundown furl'd the fore sail & Gaff sail & luffed by the wind heading S.E. by E. Middle the same. Leather the same. put the stern boat on the main deck for repair & ends. Lat 6.48 & Long by Chron 9.38 E

Tuesday 10th This day weather fine steering by the wind heading S.E. by E. Saw some fish Employed in fixing the stern boat - middle the same. Leather all sail out heading S.E. & ends. Lat 6.40 & Long by Chron 10.18 E

Wednesday 11th This day opens with fine breeze from S.W. steering S.E. & E. At sundown furl'd the light sail. Middle Steered the same. At seven made all sail Steered N. by W. & ends. Capt employed in repairing the stern boat - last morning while I was on deck he told me of the boat steering to clear out - the stern boat & after I went up to mast-head he told the second mate to take her in an shack which he did. instead of the Capt. telling me which I think it his duty. & today I made a new boat-bucket & I had a little paint of any own & painted it. & as soon as he saw that he put the ships paintail in his room
