

Journal of J. J. J. Concluded.

Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup>

This twenty four hours  
opens with very light breeze from S. S. W.  
Steering by the wind heading S. E. & S. E.  
Middle & Staker sail. Saw some sail  
to the South. We furled fore & main sail  
At four A.M. employed in fitting a collar  
to the gilltop sail. At 10 A.M. made  
all sail for a cat's paw. So ends  
Lat 23° 2' S Long 72° 28'

Thursday 30<sup>th</sup>

This day opens with a calm  
At four had a light wind from S. S. W.  
Steered by the wind to the S. E. Middle  
the Lamb. At eight wind veered to  
the S. E. tacked ship, headed to the  
S. E. W. Saw jacks. So ends  
Lat 23° 2' S Long 72° 28'

Friday 31<sup>st</sup> (1840)

This day opens with  
very light winds from the S. E. Steer  
ing by the wind heading S. by W.  
At sundown calm furled every thing  
At twelve midnight had a light wind  
from S. S. W. At eight A.M. tacked ship  
wind veering to the Eastward heading by  
the wind S. S. W. Saw one sail  
At nine A.M. saw blackfish going to the  
South. Lowered all three boats & got five  
Starboard three Starboard one & the waist  
So ends  
Lat 23° 2' S Long 72° 28'

Journal of July Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup>

So day weather  
fine First part calm employed in tidying for  
the ship got on board hauled the fish in &  
got supper At sundown wind blowing some harder  
so much so she is under storage way Employed  
through the night on the black fish blubber  
steered by the wind heading S. S. W. Middle  
the Lamb. At four A.M. tacked ship heading  
S. E. by E. S. E. Employed in scrubbing  
Blackfish meat & mincing blubber So ends  
Lat 23° 1' S Long 71° 5' E

Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup>

This day opens with light breeze  
& thick weather with a heavy swell  
Steering down the South, Steering by the wind  
heading East. At two P.M. tacked ship  
headed South employed in mincing  
blubber. At twelve midnight tacked heading  
S. E. by E. At two A.M. finished mincing  
butten had light breeze. So ends  
Lat 23° 4' S Long 71° 27' E

Monday 4<sup>th</sup>

This day opens with light  
breezes from S. S. W. Steering by the wind  
on Eastern tack Saw breeches called them  
jumpers Middle wind the same tacked  
ship several times. At day break on the  
Eastern tack. At nine A.M. saw a Hump  
back going quick to the leeward. Lowered five  
two part boats & gave chase came back at  
half past ten. Steered by the wind  
heading E by S. S. E. So ends  
Lat 23° 6' S Long 71° 52' E
