 shot furling our sails, feeling pleased
 as we are safe at anchor Middle Term Steady
 weather. At 9 A.M. there were three men
 came off to hold a sermon on the Schooner
 descended the pumps found 12 inches water
 there at eleven they went on shore employed
 in drying sails & building the blubber So ends

Wednesday 2nd
 The first part five employed in
 hauling & sent for a store which came at three
 P.M. at four down all through Middle
 & latter the same six men gone with
 the Dockyard with the Consul
 employed in filling a cask with
 oil. So ends

Thursday 3rd
 Opens with fresh S.W.
 wind. Weather rising So ends

Friday 4th
 Showers S.W. winds &
 rain Middle & the same At 10 O.C.
 took went before the Consul to sign
 the Protest So ends

Saturday 5th
 Weather fine Employed in
 drying sails, wind S.W. Weather fine
 wind from North So ends

Going to anchor at Bermuda
 Sunday 6th
 Opens with fine weather
 latter the same At 10 A.M. the water
 went on shore being sick & it being the
 doctors advice to pass my own board
 will So ends Our bark arrived

Sunday 7th
 Weather fine, doing nothing
 worth note. Latter the same &
 So ends

Tuesday 8th
 Same rain pumped Rheo
 as usual found out oil leaking broke
 out the top tier, found the ground tier
 slack So ends

Wednesday 9th
 Some squalls & rain
 Employed in pumping water from casks
 in the hold to casks on deck
 So ends

Thursday 10th
 weather variable weather
 through out the day found more oil
 coming to the pump So ends

Friday 11th
 To day weather rising with
 strong breeze Middle & latter the
 same So ends

Saturday 12th
 Strong breeze from
 the S.W. & West of Hands busy
 on shore looking out for a
 boat So ends
