Wednesday 23rd

To day fine with strong South winds Middle the same weather the same Employed in work on the head rigging. Had two bigger arrive So ends with four cokers at work
Thursday 24th

To day open fine wind South. Employed on the head gear Middle fine weather showery wind West So ends

Friday 25th

To day fine wind West but light. This PM two cokers to work Middle fine weather also wind North At eight PM the riggers went to work stripping her of her rigging One Carpenter & four cokers to work So ends

Saturday 26

To day fine & moderate riggers had her stripped to a gunline cokers & one carpenter to work At eight PM heard a noise on deck went up found two of the men this asked the cook what he was doing said he was after a ~~board~~ board told him to be careful & not get in or scrape for I had rather give him a dollar out of my own pocket in about 20 minutes after one of the men came up from below saying there was a barrel of meat open forward I told him to get it off under my window Middle fine weather also

Still at Bermuda. 1840

Sunday 27th

To day fine Employed in scraping pitch This afternoon the police carried two men off to the lockup for carrying of beef on shore Middle & latter fine So ends

Monday 28th

To day fine weather employed in scraping pitch had one man putting on copper & four cokers to work So ends wind S.W. another barge arrived in darkness So ends

Tuesday 29th

First part fine Employed in scraping out side of the ship Middle the same weather had cokers to work So ends

Wednesday 30th

To day first part some rain Middle & latter fine Employed in shifting our position two hours & 40 So ends

Thursday 1st

To day fine had six cokers to work caulking. Harrel employed in scraping off pitch from the deck. Received one barrel of pork Last fine also So ends

Friday 2nd

To day fine first part employed in draining casks of oil & scraping pitch ~~from~~ Middle & latter some rain So ends
