Steamship Korea Captain W. B. Seabury

Sunday July 20th

Note

Came in with squally weather and at 7 A.M. took our anchor and started to steam through the Straights. When we took our anchor we was 95 miles from the Pacific Ocean proper and at 4-15 Cape Pillar was off our port beam and that put us in the Pacific Ocean

Monday July 21st

Came in with fresh gale from S.W. and ship heading up the coast of South America bound to Cornell to get some coal. Crew employed getting gear ready for coaling

Tuesday July 22nd

Came in with strong breeze and heavy swell from S.W. Crew employed at cleaning up generally between decks

Wednesday July 23rd

Came in with a heavy swell and strong westerly winds. Crew employed at rigging gear to coal our ship at Cornell.

Thursday July 24th

Note

Came in with fresh breeze from West. At 8 A.M. anchored off of the town of Cornell and commenced to coal ship at 11:00 A.M. Cornell is about ten miles to the south of Conception. Chile and is a small town and nothing more than a coaling station

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Bound to San Francisco by Straights of Magellan.

Friday July 25th

Came in with squalls of rain and generally bad weather but we were taking coal all day until 4 P.M.

Saturday July 26th

Note

Came in with strong breeze from South. Did not get any coal until 11:00 A.M. on account of bad weather. Finished coaling at 5 P.M. and at 5:30 P.M. got under way and steamed out of the harbor of Cornell while showing our next port is San Francisco if nothing happens.

Sunday July 27th

Came in with fresh breeze from S.S.W. and steering to course S. 26° W. Crew doing nothing all day after washing off this morning

Lat 34° 30' S.

Long 75° 59' W.

Monday July 28th

Came in with a brisk breeze from S.S.W. and crew employed at cleaning ship all day

Lat 28° 27' S.

Tuesday July 29th

Came in with fresh breeze from S.E. and ship heading for Frisco. Crew employed at scrubbing paint-work and cleaning the hoisting wench

Lat 23° 18' S.
