

Bark Inaco of New Bedford

Wednesday Feb 7<sup>th</sup> 1844

Begin with light breezes from the N steering S  
saw 2 sails Mid and latter parts light airs &  
calm sun - four sails No Lat Long by Chron 19 46

Thursday Feb 8<sup>th</sup> 1844

Begin with light airs & calm & showers of rain  
Mid part the same latter - a light breeze  
from the SSE sun - black fish lowered and  
and got one Lat by Chron 35 5 N Long 19 25

Friday Feb 9<sup>th</sup> 1844

Begin with gentle breezes from the SSE  
all clear heading SW saw 3 sails Mid and  
latter parts the same Lat 31 5 N Long 19 50

Saturday Feb 10<sup>th</sup> 1844

Begin with gentle breezes from the S heading  
WSW at 2 PM the wind hauled back to the  
SE saw 4 sails at 7 hours the WSW at 4 AM  
tackled the SE by S saw 2 sails Lat by Chron 30 4 N Long 19 46

Sunday Feb 11<sup>th</sup> 1844

Begin with light breezes from the SW and clear  
heading SSE Mid and latter part the same

Lat by Chron 24 0 N Long by Chron 19 00 by Dist 19 04 W

Monday Feb 12<sup>th</sup> 1844

Begin with light breezes from the SW heading  
SSE saw 4 sails at 6 PM spoke an English man of war  
did not understand her name from Australia bound  
to London Mid part the same latter squally at 10 AM  
tackled to the WSW spoke a Portuguese bark latter  
calm Lat 20 4 N Long 19 00 W

Tuesday Feb 13<sup>th</sup> 1844

Begin calm at 4 PM took a breeze from  
the N steered S by W Mid and latter parts the same  
saw black fish lowered without effect Lat 14 1 48 N No Long

Wednesday Feb 14<sup>th</sup> 1844

Begin with light breezes from the N steering S by W  
saw 11 sails Mid and latter much the same saw  
12 sails Lat 8 05 N Long 18 30 W

On a Whaling Voyage

Thursday Feb 15<sup>th</sup> 1844

Begin with light airs and huffling from  
N to W saw 10 sails all bound S Mid and latter  
parts squally and rainy Lat Long 19 09 W

Friday Feb 16<sup>th</sup> 1844

Begin with light airs and calm at 5 PM took a breeze  
from the SSE headed SW ships all around us  
Mid and latter parts the same Lat 00 29 S Long 18 50

Saturday Feb 17<sup>th</sup> 1844

Begin with light breezes from the SSE and clear  
heading SW at 5 PM exchanged Longs with a French  
brig steering N Mid and latter parts the same  
saw nothing Lat by Chron 20 1 S Long 18 20

Sunday Feb 18<sup>th</sup> 1844

Begin with fresh breezes from the SSE and clear  
heading SW saw one sail Mid and latter parts  
the same heading WSW Lat 3 28 S Long 20 20 W

Monday Feb 19<sup>th</sup> 1844

Begin with gentle breezes from the SSE heading SW  
saw nothing Mid and latter parts the same saw  
one sail Lat 5 01 S Long 21 40 W

Tuesday Feb 20<sup>th</sup> 1844

Begin with gentle trades and clear heading SW  
all sail set Mid and latter parts the same Lat 04 52 S Long 22 00

Wednesday Feb 21<sup>st</sup> 1844

Begin with fresh trades and clear heading SW by S saw  
nothing Mid and latter parts the same saw two sails  
Lat 9 19 S Long 23 15 W

Thursday Feb 22<sup>nd</sup> 1844

Begin with fresh trades and clear heading SW by S  
Mid and latter parts the same Lat 11 43 S Long 25 15 W

Friday Feb 23<sup>rd</sup> 1844

Begin with fresh trades and clear heading SW  
Mid and latter parts the same Lat 13 42 S Long 26 25

Saturday Feb 24<sup>th</sup> 1844

Begin with gentle trades and clear heading  
SW all sail set saw nothing Mid and  
latter the same Lat 16 00 S Long 26 42 W
