110 Sunday April 7th 1844

Begins with fresh gales from the SW and squally steering S by E mid the same latter part moderate made all sail Lat 36 23 Long 42 40 E

111 Monday April 8th 1844

Begins with light breezes from the SW and clear steering S by E latter part light breezes from the N Lat 36 27 S Long 44 30 E

112 Tuesday April 9th 1844

Begins with gentle breezes from the N and clear steering S by E all sail set mid and latter part the same Lat 36 45 S Long 47 45 E

113 Wednesday April 10th 1844

Begins with fresh breezes from the N and clear steering S by E at 6 PM took a squall from W mid part huffing winds latter fresh gales from the S double reefed the top sails Lat 37 00 S Long 50 25 E

114 Thursday April 11th 1844

Begins with fresh gales from the S and squally steering S by E latter part wind S by E heading E heavy weather Lat 36 00 S Long 52 20 E

115 Friday April 12th 1844

Begins with heavy breezes from the S by E heading E at 4 PM heavy squalls close reefed the main top sail took in fore and mid and latter part the same heading S by E Lat 34 05 S Long 53 30 E

116 Saturday April 13th 1844

Begins with fresh gales from the SSW and clear heading S by E set the main sail and mid and latter part moderate mid and latter part heading S by E Lat 34 44 S Long 57 08 E

117 Sunday April 14th 1844

Begins with light breezes from the S by E and clear heading E all sail set at mid taken to the S latter the same heading S by E Lat 34 44 S Long 56 40 E

118 Monday April 15th 1844

Begins with light winds and calm latter part light breezes from NW and clear steering S by E Lat 35 02 S Long 57 35 E

117 Tuesday April 16th 1844

Begins with light breezes from the NW and clear steering S by E all sail set mid part the same at 6 AM the wind veered to the SW some rain Lat 35 31 S Long 60 00 E

120 Wednesday April 17th 1844

Begins with light breezes from the SSW and clear steering S by E all sail set no whales but a plenty of fin backs clear and clear what a voyage what a passage mid and latter part strong gales from the NW double reefed the top sails Lat 35 40 S Long 63 20 E

121 Thursday April 18th 1844

Begins with fresh gales from the WSW and clear steering S by E mid and latter part moderate made all sail Lat 35 31 S Long 65 40 E

122 Friday April 19th 1844

Begins with light breezes from the NW and clear steering S by E mid and latter part fresh gales Lat 35 50 S Long 68 10 E

123 Saturday April 20th 1844

Begins with fresh breezes from the NW and clear heading steering S by E took in the light mid and latter part the same Lat 35 59 S Long 72 35 E

124 Sunday April 21st 1844 19 miles

Begins with fresh gales from the West and some hard squalls steering S by E double reefed the top sails mid and latter much the same wind S by E Lat 35 38 S Long 75 40 E

125 Monday April 22nd 1844

Begins with fresh gales from the SW and clear steering S by E mid part the same latter more moderate wind S by E headed E set the top sails Lat 34 55 S Long 78 20 E

126 Tuesday April 23rd 1844

Begins with fresh breezes from SSW and clear heading E double reefed the top sails mid and latter part a hard gale close reefed main top sail took in the fore Lat 34 04 S Long 79 40 E
