Begins with light breezes from the SSW and cloudy heading S.E. and remember us in many good us a short voyage latter calm and clear Lat 29 07 Long 110 15

Sunday Nov-10th 1844

Begins with light breezes from the WSW and clear steering S at night heading SW bar falling 29th at 6 PM Mid and latter part the same Lat 30 03 Long 110 30

Monday Nov-11th 1844

Begins with gentle breezes from the WSW and clear heading South Mid and latter the same heading S.E. Lat 30 17 Long 111 10

Tuesday Nov-12th 1844

Begins with gentle breezes from the SSW and clear heading S.E. saw nothing no whales Mid and latter the same at 8 AM were ship to the W at 5 to the S.E. saw nothing Lat 31 14 Long 112 15

Wednesday Nov-13th 1844

Begins with gentle breezes from the SW and clear heading S.E. bar 29th clear the trouble of sailors they are never satisfied at 8 PM were ship to the W at 3 am to the S.E. at 9 to the WSW bent the second best main top sail bar 29th Lat 31 34 Long 112 45

Thursday Nov-14th 1844

Begins with strong breezes from the SW and cloudy heading WSW saw nothing at 6 PM 29th at day light were ship to the S.E. latter the same Lat 31 16 Long 112 25

Friday Nov-15th 1844

Begins with strong gales from SW and clear heading S.E. at 6 PM were ship to the W at 4 am began to moderate bar rising latter part made sail saw nothing Lat 31 38 Long 112 25

After Spies on Oil

Saturday Nov-16th 1844

Begins with gentle breezes from the S.E. and showers of rain heading SSW Come Whales Can Mid and latter part fine pleasant weather employed in repairing the J.T. & sail saw-grompers Lat 32 06 Long 111 52 by Elms 111 32

Sunday Nov-17th 1844

Begins with light breeze and calm saw one fisher back latter part took a light breeze from the SW steering S.E. saw nothing

Lat 32 47 S Long 111 37 by Elms 111 29

Monday Nov-18th 1844

Begins with gentle breezes from the SSW heading S.E. no whales to be seen Mid and latter part fresh gales from the SW unbent the fore sail to repair and bent another one Lat 34 16 Long 113 00

Tuesday Nov-19th 1844

Begins with fresh gales from the SW and clear heading to the S.E. nothing in sight this day bar 29th latter part fine weather employed in repairing the fore sail Lat 34 35 Long 113 55

Wednesday Nov-20th 1844

Begins with gentle breezes from the S and cloudy heading S.E. at 6 PM saw Cape Cod in boreing 24 N Dist 40 miles saw Whales at the same time at 6 PM down boats the whales going to the NW very quick got nothing clear clear - found great success at 12 Mid took to the S.E. at 8 am to the SSW Lat 36 37 Long 114 00

at 8 am saw Cape Cod in boreing to the S 40 miles Dist

Thursday Nov-21th 1844

Begins with gentle breezes from the S.E. and clear heading SSW saw a quantity of Squirrels and birds at 5 PM took to the S.E. the haul to 3 at 10 Mid took to the S at 8 to the E employed in repairing the main sail saw-grompers Lat 35 08 Long 114 58
