Tuesday March 18<sup>th</sup> 1845

Begins with a fresh breeze from WNW  
at 4 PM takes to the SW at 10 to the NW  
later heading NW saw nothing but Killers  
Lat 36.56 S Long 115 15 E

Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> 1845

Begins with light breezes from the SW and clear  
heading NW at 8 PM saw Cape Horn bearing  
N by W at 6 the Cape bore N dist 20 miles  
Came Whales Come Mid part calm later light  
light breezes and huffling saw saw from  
N by W to ESE dist 20 miles Lat 34.47 S Long 115 20

Thursday March 20<sup>th</sup> 1845

Begins with a light breeze from WSW at 4 PM  
heads to SW takes to the W saw the land at  
6 to the ESE 25 miles dist later part fresh  
breezes from the SE steering NW Lat 34.60 S Long 114.20

Friday March 21<sup>st</sup> 1845

Begins with fresh breezes from the SE  
and clear steering NW at night shortened  
sail later the same steered WSW repaired  
& bent the old main top sail Lat 33 15 S Long 112 50

Saturday March 22<sup>nd</sup> 1845

Begins with gentle breezes from the SE  
and changing steering NW at night steered  
NW while stuck the main top sail

Mid and later part much the same  
saw nothing Lat 32 03 S Long 111 00 E

Sunday March 23<sup>rd</sup> 1845

Begins with fresh gales from the WSW  
and clear heading NW later steered W

Lat 30 55 S Long 110 30

Monday March 24<sup>th</sup> 1845

Begins with fresh breezes the SE and clear  
heading E at night veered ship to the SW  
saw nothing later part the same

Lat 31 08 S Long 110 02 E

Cruising for Sperm Whales

Tuesday March 25<sup>th</sup> 1845

Begins with fresh gales from the SE  
steering ESE at night headed E nothing  
to be seen Come Whales Come 6 saw 2 went  
then we look for help grant us the blessing  
again keep us from murmuring at the will  
and may we be thankful for the part and  
for all we receive at the Hand at 1 AM  
veered ship to the SW later steered NW

Lat 30 24 S Long 110 35

Wednesday March 26<sup>th</sup> 1845

Begins with fresh breezes from the SE  
and clear heading E at night veered ship  
to the SW Mid and later same saw  
nothing Lat 30 26 S Long 109 35

Thursday March 27<sup>th</sup> 1845

Begins with strong gales from S heading  
W by W at night veered ship to the ESE and  
thin is bad weather for whaling Mid and  
later the same Lat 30 18 S Long 109 25 E

Friday March 28<sup>th</sup> 1845

Begins with strong gales from the SE  
heading E at night veered ship to the SW  
no Whales no Whales no prospect of Whales  
Mid and later same Lat 30 20 S Long 109 20

Saturday March 29<sup>th</sup> 1845

Begins with fresh gales from the SE and clear  
heading E and clear when shall we get good  
Weather Mid and later same saw nothing

Lat 30 15 S Long by Chron 109 00 by Dist 108 45

Sunday March 30<sup>th</sup> 1845

Begins with fresh gales from the SE and  
clear heading E at 12 Mid veered to the SW  
at day light to E Lat 30 02 S Long by Chron 109 20 by Dist 109 30

Monday March 31<sup>st</sup> 1845

Begins with steady breezes from the SE and clear  
heading E later part some moderate bad sail  
once more Lat 29 44 S Long by Chron 110 00 by Dist 110 00 E
