Tuesday April 15th 1845

Begins with gentle Trades and clear heading E by N at night veered ship to the S by W - latter steers W Lat 23 46 Long 110 15

Wednesday April 16th 1845

Begins with gentle breezes from the S steering W at 1 PM saw a large sperm whale lowered without effort. O dear this is hard but we must be patient at night came on board and headed E by N and latter point heading different ways Lat 23 43 Long 109 50

Thursday April 17th 1845

Begins with fresh breezes from the S steering W at night headed E by N at 11 PM veered ship to the S by W saw jumpers Lat 23 42 Long 109 15

Friday April 18th 1845

Begins with strong breezes from the S by E steering W at night veered ship to the E saw jumpers & 10 months out and poor one we but little oil and Home a great gift off O God be gracious to us again grant us a good season. O dear when shall we get Home latter part headed S by W

Saturday April 19th 1845

Begins with fresh gales from S by E heading E latter part steers S by E Lat 22 39 Long 110 05

Sunday April 20th 1845

Begins with fresh Trades and cloudy steering S by W saw nothing at night headed S by W veered ship at 4 PM and at 6 AM saw nothing

Monday April 21st 1845

Begins with light Trades and clear heading S by W at night steers to the E and latter part light airs and calm

Lat 23 03 Long 108 50

Much in amount of sperm oil

Tuesday April 22^d 1845

Begins with light airs and calm no Whales this day till and latter part calm

Lat 22 55 Long 109 50

Wednesday April 23^d 1845

Begins with a calm at 8 AM spoke the ship young Phoenix Michael 5 months from New Bedford 80 bls sperm got a letter from Home latter part gentle trades heading E by N

Lat 22 53 Long 109 50

Thursday April 24th 1845

Begins with gentle breezes from the S by E heading E by N at 8 PM saw the young Phoenix after Whales for 7 miles to the Windward down boats at 5 the off P boats fastened and got the whale. Found grant us a whale at 3 PM veered to the S by W at 7 saw a whale at 8 lowered and struck a whale got store and lost a line so ended the boats off Lat 22 14

Friday April 25th 1845

Begins with gentle trades the boat off at 4 PM struck a large whale at 5 took him to the ship latter part employed in cutting blubber made good work of it Lat 22 55 Long 110 39

Saturday April 26th 1845

Begins with strong gales first got the body in and veered ship to the S by E latter fine weather took in the head Lat 22 40 Long 110 15

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Sunday April 27th 1845

Begins with light breezes heading S by W employed in boiling M and latter part calm

Monday April 28th 1845

Begins with a calm finished boiling at 8 PM M and latter part much the same
