Begins with fresh gales from the SSW and clear employed in stowing down at night finished veered ship to the ESE at day light veered to the WSW

Friday May 2nd 1845
Begins with gentle breezes and clear heading WSW at 7 am spoke the ship young Phoenix Come Whaler Come Mid and latter the same Lat 22 48 Long 109 50

Begins with light breezes from the SSE heading E saw the Atlantic finished building at 1 am latter spoke the Hope and Atlantic

Sunday May 11th 1845
Begins with light breezes at 5 spoke the young Phoenix and had a general gain Mid and latter parts the same heading SW
