Monday May 14th 1845

Begins with fresh trades and clear heading
SW at night veered ship to the E saw
the young Phoenix latter part steering down
heading SSW Lat 23 10 Long 108 15 E

Tuesday May 15th 1845

Begins with gentle breezes from the SE and clear
heading SSW - heavy steering down latter part
the same Lat 23 03 Long 108 35

Wednesday May 16th 1845

Begins with light airs and calm finished
steering down a noble whale 94 blks all
ready for - more may God bless us with
some more latter part gentle breezes from
the N steering SE Lat 23 55 Long 109 20

Thursday May 17th 1845 - by dist 108 40

Begins with gentle breezes from the N and
clear steering SE at night hauled to the N
and lay aback at 9 veered ship to the W
Bar 29.75 Lat 24 00 Long 109 50

Friday May 18th 1845

Begins with fresh breezes from the NW
heading west cloudy and some rain impeded
in setting up shoals saw one ship mid part
heavy rain latter part W steering NW
Bar 29.75 Lat 24 15 Long 109 30

Saturday May 19th 1845

Begins with gentle breezes from the SSW and
cloudy at 1 PM saw whales going to the S down
board and chased got nothing in line among the
sawboard but got stone she is always getting
stone got out another took her in to repair
latter steered NW repaired the stone Boat
saw-fin back Lat 24 13 Long 109 20 E

Sunday May 20th 1845

Begins with fresh trades and a heavy swell steered
SW Mi's part lay aback latter steered N
Lat 23 20 Long 109 10 E

On the Coast of New Holland 71

Monday May 19th 1845

Begins with gentle trades head to the SW
at 2 PM spoke the ship Hope at night saw
sprouts at a dist could not tell what they were
latter part light wind steering to the NW
Bar 29.75 Lat 23 20 Long 108 20

Tuesday May 20th 1845

Begins with light airs and calm at night
spoke the young Phoenix boiling a small
whale latter part fresh breezes steered
E wind took the girth in to repair
Bar 29.75 No Lat 23

Wednesday May 21st May 1845

Begins with fresh gales from the W steered
E at night hauled to the N showers of rain
at day light steered S saw fin back's
and 1 ship Lat 23 18 Long 109 30

Thursday May 22nd 1845

Begins with gentle breezes from the W and clear
steering NE at night hauled to the N the N and
latter part strong breezes from the WSW
Bar 29.75 Lat 22 42 Long 109 55

Friday May 23rd 1845

Begins with strong breezes from the WSW
and clear steering ESE at night hauled
to the S O land took they seaward where to
go Mi's and latter part light trades
heading to the E Lat 22 39 Long 111 20

Saturday May 24th 1845

Begins with light breezes from the S and
clear heading to the E at 3 PM veered ship
to the W Mi's and latter same Lat 22 15 Long 110 20

Sunday May 25th 1845

Begins with light breezes from the SSE
and clear heading to the SW Mi's and latter
same steering SW Lat 23 04 Long 110 00
