Mon. May 26th 1845
 Begins with light trades and clear - steering
 WSW at night hauled to the 3rd better Stead
 W saw five backs Lat 23 28 Long 109 50 E

Tues. May 27th 1845
 Begins with light breezes from the SE
 and clear - steering WSW - five backs lowered
 and chased them but got nothing better - put
 light airs from the SE W headed
 WSW Lat 23 53 Long by Chron 109 30 by dist 108 53
 the Chron is 37 miles to the E

Wed. May 28th 1845
 Begins with light airs and blowing sun - Heiler
 down boats and got one spoke the ship's Heiler
 boats she has not got a whale for 5 months
 Mid part wind hauled to the S and rained
 and better clear - fresh breezes Lat 23 20 Long 108 28

Thurs. May 29th 1845
 Begins with fresh breezes from the SSW
 and clear - heading WSW - nothing clear
 when shall we get a whale Mid and better
 fresh breezes from the SSE Lat 23 25 Long 107 30

Fri. May 30th 1845
 Begins with fresh gales from the SSE
 and clear - heading to the SW - better same
 in place in boiling Heiler blubber

Sat. May 31st 1845
 Begins with fresh trades at 3 PM saw
 large school of Whales down boats but
 got none Mid and better same saw
 nothing Lat 23 20 Long 106 45

Sunday June 1st 1845
 Begins a bad gale from the SSE heading
 E at night veered ship to the SW
 Mid and better same Lat 23 01 Long 106 36

Cruising for Sperm Oil

Monday June 2nd 1845
 Begins with fresh trades and clear - heading
 E at night hauled to the 3rd better Stead
 look dark 14th Months out 750 but I hope for
 the best the Lord has been good to us and I
 still trust He will not forsake us Mid and
 better part the same heading SW - saw jumpers
 Lat 23 01 Long 106 30

Tuesday June 3rd 1845
 Begins with fresh trades and clear - heading
 E at night hauled to the 3rd better Stead
 Lat 22 23 Long 108 53

Wednesday June 4th 1845
 Begins with a fresh gale at 12th saw a school
 of small whales going SW lowered the
 boats without success at 5 PM veered ship to
 the SSW at 6 PM veered to the SE
 saw five backs Lat 22 29 Long 106 45

Thursday June 5th 1845
 Begins with fresh trades and clear - heading
 E at night hauled to the 3rd better Stead
 Mid and better same saw moderate
 Made sail to the S found the ship has a small
 leak in rough weather - Lat 23 01 Long 107 20

Fri. June 6th 1845
 Begins with light breezes from the SSE and
 clear - heading S saw five backs better light
 winds from NW steered E saw five backs
 Lat 23 01 Long 107 20

Saturday June 7th 1845
 Begins with light winds from NW steered
 E at night hauled to the 3rd better Stead
 at 10 PM the wind hauled to the SSE heavy squalls
 better strong gales and cloudy Lat 23 46 Long 108 50

Sunday June 8th 1845
 Begins with strong gales from SSE heading E
 saw nothing Mid and better - same the
 same Lat 22 15 Long 109 20
