Tuesday June 10th 1845

Begins with fresh breezes and clear heading S^W latter pleasant weather

Wednesday June 11th 1845

Begins with light breezes from the E^SE and clear heading S^{SW} saw fin backs in abundance Mid part calm latter light breeze from the W steers S^{SE} no whales S^E Whales

Thursday June 12th 1845

Begins with fresh breezes from the S^W heading S^{SE} at 2 am veered to the W at 7 to the E^{SE}

Begins with fresh breezes from the S heading E^{SE} saw fin backs in abundance O God grant us some whales give us patience O God at night veered ship to the S^W latter fresh gales no whales

Begins with strong gales from S^E and clear heading S^W Mid and latter parts the same

Begins with fresh gales and clear heading S^{SW} at night veered ship to the E^{SE} saw fin backs latter steers W^{SW} saw fin back

Begins with fresh breezes from S^E and clear heading S^W at night veered ship to the E^{SE} Mid and latter moderate

Begins with light breezes from S^W saw fin backs at 6 AM spoke the Bark Hoagley Townsend of Warren 10 months out with Spinn Mid and latter headed S^{SE} Lat 23 00 Long 109 21

Wednesday June 18th 1845

Begins with fine breezes from S^W and clear heading S^{SW} saw fin backs in abundance O God grant us some Oil 18 months out when shall we get home sweet Home the Lord what is best for us this part calm latter gentle breezes from S^{SW} steers W Lat 23 20 Long 109 50

Thursday June 19th 1845

Begins with fresh breezes from the S^{SW} mid squally heading W Mid and latter the same
Mon-29th

Lat 23 5 Long 109 00

Friday June 20th 1845

Begins with strong breezes from S^{SE} and clear heading S^W saw fin backs & jumpers no whales Home sick when shall we get Home the Lord Perovs rather moderate veered ship to the S^E Lat 22 47 Long 108 35
Mon-29th

Saturday June 21st 1845

Begins with light breezes from E^{SE} and cloudy heading S saw one sail latter part heading E spoke the young Phoenix & Hoagley Lat 22 50 Long 109 15
Mon-29th

Sunday June 22nd 1845

Begins with fresh Trades and clear heading E at 5 saw a sperm whale going quick to the S did not lower veered ship to S^{SW} at day light veered ship to the E latter saw jumpers & 2 ships Lat 22 31 Long 109 02
Mon-29th

Monday June 23rd 1845

Begins with fresh breezes from the S and squally heading E S at 11 Mid veered ship to the S^{SW} latter part blowing hard in squalls
Mon-29th
