Begin with a gale of wind from SSE heading E no whales no weather to get them Mid and latter the same at 10 need ships to the SSW

Friday June 27th 1845

Begin with strong gales from the SE at 6 AM squally heading SSW to SSE Mid and latter the same Lat 22 17 Long 109 10 by Lat 109 16

Begin with a fresh gale from the ESE and clear heading S Mid and latter the same by Lat 22 22 Long 108 38 by Lat 108 35

Sunday June 29th 1845

Begin with strong gales from the E heading S to SSE saw fin Backs latter Moderate wind ESE heading SE saw fin Backs

Monday June 30th 1845

Begin with gentle breezes from the ESE and clear heading SE Mid and latter parts much the same employed in setting the Head Stays at 11 am saw Whales down Bet. 50 and 70

Tuesday July 1st 1845

Begin with gentle breezes from the NE the boats off at 5 AM fastened to a whale he took 2 lines and went off spouting thick Blood latter part light air from the NE sailing different courses to look for the whale Lat 24 28 Long 109 00

Wednesday July 2nd 1845

Begin with light breeze from the W and clear at 1 PM saw a shoal of large Whales at a dist at 1, lowered the boats and run about of them as usual O God grant us thy blessings again at 2 AM the wind should to the SSW latter part fresh gales and cloudy steering E saw fin Back

Thursday July 3rd 1845

Begin with fresh gales from the SSW and clear steering E at night hauled to the SE no whales at 11 need ships to the SSW mid and latter parts squally steering E by N

Friday July 4th 1845

Begin with strong breeze from the South and squally steering E by N at night headed E O God grant us some oil I feel that we do not deserve it but in thy Mercy I trust O dem O dem Mid and latter squally rainy Lat 23 22 Long 110 15

Saturday July 5th 1845

Begin with fresh trader and clear heading from NE to ESE saw fin Backs Mid and latter the same Lat 22 20 S Long 111 30 E

Sunday July 6th 1845

Begin with fresh trader and clear heading SE at 8 am need ships to the SSW at 2 to the ESE latter the same saw fin Backs
