Monday July 7th 1845
 Begins with fresh breeze and clear heading
 ENE at night veered ship to the SW
 Mid first light air and calm latter light
 breeze from the W steered & bent the 2^d best
 main top sail and altered the 1st one for a
 fore top sail bent it and condemned the
 old fore top sail Lat 2131 Long 112 26
 Mon 29th Tuesday July 8th 1845

Begins with light air from the SW
 steered & at night hauled aback heading
 NW Mid first calm latter light breeze from
 the S and cloudy steering NE by E
 Lat 2115 Long 111 40

Wednesday July 9th 1845
 Begins with light breeze from the S and
 cloudy steering NE by E saw abundance of birds
 heard no whales at 8 AM veered to the S at 2 am
 to the latter strong breeze steered ENE
 Mon 29th Lat 2100 Long 113 10

Thursday July 10th 1845
 Begins with strong breeze from the S
 and rainy steered ENE at night veered
 ship to the SW at 2 am to the ENE latter
 clear - saw nothing Lat 20 12 Long 112 55
 Mon 29th Friday July 11th 1845

Begins with light breeze and cloudy heading
 ENE at 6 to the SW at 3 to the E
 latter NE employed in repairing the fore
 sail saw black fish no whales
 Lat 19 42 S Long by Chron 114 25 by Dist 114 13

Saturday July 12th 1845
 Begins with gentle breeze from the S and clear
 steering ENE at night veered ship and lashed
 shackle latter headed SW saw a ship steering
 NE Lat 19 31 S Long by Chron 113 58 by Dist 113 40

off North West Cape of New-Holland
 Sunday July 13th 1845

Begins with fresh breeze from the S heading
 WSW at night veered ship to the ESE
 latter heading NE Lat 18 45 Long 111 15

Monday July 14th 1845
 Begins with strong breeze from the ESE and
 clear heading NE at night veered ship to the
 S saw nothing & God grant us all this and latter
 part fine weather and no whales heading SW
 Lat 18 58 Long 111 08

Tuesday July 15th 1845
 Begins with gentle breeze from the S and
 clear heading SW at 10 veered ship to the
 ENE latter light light air from the S heading
 to the E Lat 19 16 S Long 113 50 E

Wednesday July 16th 1845
 Begins with light breeze from the S and
 clear heading E saw 1 fine Back & porpoises
 Mid and light wind saw Bluffing put
 up the black smiths forge but no smith
 to work Lat 19 06 Long 114 03 E

Thursday July 17th 1845
 Begins with light breeze from SSE heading
 SW saw nothing & clear & calm Mid and latter
 part the same Lat 19 31 Long 113 25

Friday July 18th 1845
 Begins with light breeze from S and fine
 weather heading to the E at night took
 to the SW Mid and latter same at 10 am
 took to the E saw 1 fine Back we must go
 somewhere else for Whales Lat 19 39 Long 113 15

Saturday July 19th 1845
 Begins with fresh breeze from the SSE and clear
 heading E and grant us some whales Mid part
 lay aback latter steered ENE saw porpoises
 Mon 29th Lat 18 52 Long 113 50 E
