

Barth Draco of New Bedford

Thursday Aug 14th 1845

Begins with gentle breezes from S^E heading SSW employed in setting up carp for water at night tacked to the S^E at 2 to the S^W at 4 to the S

Sun - nothing Lat 10 12 Long 118 12

Friday Aug 15th 1845

Begins with gentle breeze from SSW heading S^E at night tacked to the S^W saw Bandel Wood Island to the S^E & Lord grant us one more surge of Oil before get in at 7 tacked to the S^E saw five backs

Lat 10 05 Long 118 00

Saturday Aug 16th 1845

Begins with light S^E Trades heading to the S^W saw five backs &c at 10 PM tacked to the S^E latter part steamed on San Sumbawa to the S^E Lat 9 29 Long 117 40

Sunday Aug 17th 1845

Begins with light Trades steering S^W the land in sight from S^E to W^W at 6 PM about 15 miles dist steamed W mid on latter part running down the land bent the cables

Monday Aug 18th 1845

Begins with strong trades at 1 PM entered Atlas straits at 4 PM anchored off Bally Town in 14 fathoms of water

Tuesday Aug 19th 1845

Begins with fresh trades at 8 PM the ship dragged let go the other - Anchor - at 6 PM the boat Adventure of Lord Don came to anchor 10 minutes out 100 AM took our anchor and stood over for Sumbawa for wood so on fresh trade found Bally a good place for water and refreshments

San Allos Straits

Tuesday Aug 19th 1845

Begins with fresh trades at 1 PM anchored in 14 fathoms soft mud at the Town of Allos to get upod

Saturday Aug 20th 1845

Begins with light clear weather finishes getting wood employed in clearing the deck and getting ready for sea at 5 AM took the anchor and stood out to the sea at 11 took the trades headed S^W Sumbawa is a good harbor and a fine place for wood & Fowl

Sunday Aug 21st 1845

Begins with fresh trades steering S^W at night shortened sail heading S^W the land about 15 miles dist 6 PM grant us a successful cruise and may we be thankful to thee for the part Mid on latter part the same saw the land at a dist Lat 9 32 S Long 115 40

Monday Sept 1st 1845

Begins with gentle trades heading S^W San-fin backs Mid on latter part the same employed in storing away necessities

Lat 10 08 S Long 114 20

Tuesday Sept 2nd 1845

Begins with gentle trades and clear heading SSW saw five backs No Whales yet at 10 PM tacked to the S^E at 7 AM to S^W

Lat 10 28 Long 114 00

Wednesday Sept 3rd 1845

Begins with light trades and clear heading S^W caught a Con-fish at night tacked to the S^E Coque Whales come on - Oil has begun leak a little I hope soon to get some more to pay for it at 5 PM tacked to the S^W a strong current setting to the W

Lat 10 43 Long 113 50

Stk 24 Bats of wood
