Begins with gentle trades heading SW
Sun - nothing at 12 Mid noon to the L
at day light to the SW So ends

Lat 14 17 S Long 110 45 E

Monday Oct 27th 1845

Begins with gentle trades and clear
heading SW at night tacked to
the L and lay aback O land grant us
some oil latter steered SW

Lat 14 37 S Long 110 20

Tuesday Oct 28th 1845

Begins with gentle breezes and cloudy
steering SW at 12 Mid noon ships to the
L Mid and latter part thick rainy
weather No Lat Long 110 20 E

Wednesday Oct 29th 1845

Begins with light winds and rainy heading
L Mid and latter part much the same

Lat 14 34 Long 110 40

Thursday Oct 30th 1845

Begins with fresh breezes and cloudy light
rains heading SW at night veered to the
L latter light air and calm sun nothing

Lat 14 42 S Long 110 55 E

Friday Oct 31st 1845

Begins with light air and cloudy steering
SW at night hauled aback Come whales
come Sam home sick O land bless us & pray
the and grant us a voyage but those believe
what is best for us at sunrise saw
a large whale down boat but he soon
run out of sight of us So ends

Lat 14 29 Long 110 55 E

Saturday Nov 1st 1845

Begins with a slight breeze from ESE
and cloudy heading to the L Come
Whales Mid and latter heading different
Courses Lat 14 15 Long 111 07

Sunday Nov 2nd 1845

Begins with light breezes from the L
steering SW at night headed S aback
latter part steered S

Lat 14 42 S Long 110 35 E

Monday Nov 3rd 1845

Begins with fresh trades and clear
at steering S at 4 PM saw Whales
down boats and got one at 6 PM took
him to the ship latter employed in cutting

Lat 14 27 Long 110 30

Tuesday Nov 4th 1845

Begins with fresh breezes and had cutting
at 4 finished spoke the ship Lalla Rooke
Raymond Mr. Mowbray 600 blks Mid and
latter part heading all round the compass
at 11 spoke the L K

Lat 14 33 Long 110 50 E

Wednesday Nov 5th 1845

Begins with fresh gales heading SW
in Co with the L K employed in fishing
at day light veered to the L saw nothing

Lat 14 39 Long 110 40

Thursday Nov 6th 1845

Begins with fresh gales and clear steering
SW finished furling at night headed L
and lay aback saw the Lalla Rooke
latter part heading SW saw nothing
Come Whales

Lat 14 04 Long 111 00 E

Got a letter by the Lalla Rooke
one year old
