 heading SE sun - Porpoises employed in boiling
 Oiled grant some more. 23 months out
 about 450 when shall we get Home sam Home
 sick time will prove all things at 9 am tacked
 to the WSW finished boiling

Thursday Nov 20th 1845

Begins with gentle breezes from the S heading
 SE at night tacked to the WSW sun - black
 fish & no whales Mid and latter parts
 the same Lat 1240 Long 11300

Friday Nov 21st 1845

Begins with fresh trade heading E at night
 tacked to the SW sun - nothing Come Whales
 Come Lord grant that we may get Home
 in 3 years with 2000 bbls Mid and latter
 the same Lat 1254 S Long 112 10 E

Saturday Nov 22^d 1845

Begins with gentle breezes at 5 PM spoke
 the Otranto Mid and latter part heading
 SW Lat 1306 Long 111 30

Sunday Nov 23^d 1845

Begins with gentle breezes at 10 PM spoke
 the ship young Phoenix. Mitchell of New-Bedford
 12 1/2 months out 300 bbls at 10 am tacked to
 the SE the 3 P in sight

Lat 1317 S Long 111 10 E

Monday Nov 24th 1845

Begins with gentle trades heading SE E
 sun - black fish god grant us some oil at 10 am
 tacked to the WSW Lat 1335 Long 111 50

Tuesday Nov 25th 1845

Begins with strong trades heading SE E
 at night tacked to the SW Mid and
 latter the same saw some spouts to the
 min around but could not tell what they were

Lat 1350 Long 111 20 E

Cruising for Whales

Wednesday Nov 26th 1845

Begins with strong trades heading SW
 sun - nothing Come Whales Come
 at 9 am tacked to the E

Lat 1414 S Long 109 40 E

Thursday Nov 27th 1845

Begins with fresh trades and cloudy
 heading E by S at 10 am tacked to the WSW

Lat 1421 Long 110 20

Friday Nov 28th 1845

Begins with fresh trades and clear
 heading ESE no whales to be seen
 at 1 pm tacked to the WSW sun
 jumpers Lat 1434 S Long 110 30

Saturday Nov 29th 1845

Begins with gentle trades and clear
 heading E by S Come Whales Come O Lord
 grant us some oil let us be thankful
 for the part for there must be
 kind to us at 1 tacked to the WSW

Lat 1458 S Long 110 30 E

Sunday Nov 30th 1845

Begins with gentle trades and cloudy
 steering NW E sun - the young Phoenix
 I find that our oil is leaking bad
 at night headed WSW at 10 tacked to
 the SE at day light to the SW

Lat 1454 S Long 110 20 E

Monday Dec 1st 1845

Begins with fresh trades and cloudy at
 5 PM spoke the ship Lalla Rookh 12 1/2
 months out & young Phoenix 300 latter
 steered SW saw 2 ships

Lat 14 42 Long 110 25
