Sun 29th Sunday Jan 11th 1846

Begins with fresh breezes from the SW and strong steady NW caught a Porpoise at night heeled ship to the SSE latter part fine weather saw ~~Porpoises~~ Porpoises & Black Fish no Whales
 Mon-29th Lat 35-08 S Long 110-25 E

Monday Jan 12th 1846

Begins with gentle breezes from the SW and clear heading SSE Mid and latter a dead calm Lat 35-30 S Long 111-00
 Mon-30th Tuesday Jan 13th 1846

Begins with a dead calm caught an Albatross employed in making fish lines struck a shark no Whales no money no go home and I am home sick latter part light breeze and huffling
 Mon-29th Lat 35-12 Long 111-30

Wednesday Jan 14th 1846

Begins with gentle breezes from the S heading ESE latter part fresh breezes
 Mon-29th Lat 35-08 Long 112-20

Thursday Jan 15th 1846

Begins with fresh breeze from the SSE heading E. saw Porpoises No Whales O Lord I pray thee not to forsake us grant us success again teach us where to go at 1 PM heeled ship to the SW of S Lat 34-18 Long 112-45
 Mon-30- Friday Jan 16th 1846

Begins with fresh gales from the SE and clear heading SW of S at 6 PM heeled ship to the ESE Lat 35-16 S Long 112-10 E
 Mon-30- Saturday Jan 17th 1846

Begins with gentle breezes from the SE at 1 PM saw sperm Whales going to the windward quick down boat but saw nothing more of them O dear what luck when shall we get home

off West Australia for Whales

Saturday Jan 17th 1846

We cannot catch whales this is the third time we have seen them going so quick that it was no use lowering a boat

at 11 heeled ship to the SW at 6 AM to the E at 11 spoke the bark Otranto Cuyahalla 154 months 100 Sp Lat 34-52 Long 112-50 E
 Mon-30- Sunday Jan 18th 1846

Begins with fresh breezes from the SSE heading E at 6 heeled to the SW Mid and latter heeled ship several times the O in sight Lat 34-45 Long 112-30
 Mon-30th Monday Jan 19th 1846

Begins with fresh gales from the SE and clear heading SW of S Mid and latter the same Lat 35-05 Long 112-00
 Mon-30th Tuesday Jan 20th 1846

Begins with strong gales from the SE heading SE of S Mid and latter a hard gale heading S Lat 35-48 Long 111-45
 Mon-30- Wednesday Jan 21st 1846

Begins with fresh gales from the E heading SSE Mid and latter light winds and hazy Lat 36-13 S Long 111-30 E
 Mon-30th Thursday Jan 22nd 1846

Begins with a calm and hazy at 4 AM to a breeze from SW steered SE latter part light airs and huffling No Whales
 Mon-30th Friday Jan 23rd 1846

Begins with a calm and clear bent the 2nd best fore sail at 6 PM took a light breeze from the W O Lord grant us some whales this cruise Mid and latter part gentle breezes from the W steering SE employed in putting a new hunt to the main top sail
 Lat 36-11 S Long 112-45
