Wednesday Feb 1st 1846

Begins with gentle breeze from the SW and cloudy finished cutting and stowed to the SSE employed in boiling M^o and latter same coopering. Casks to stow
Bar 29.75 Lat 35-29

Thursday Feb 5th 1846

Begins with fresh breeze from the W and cloudy employed in boiling & coopering at 11 AM spoke the bark Thermo. Grinnell of Warren 4 months out 250 sp 200 whale the Phoenix run down at the same time M^o and latter fresh strong gales and rainy put some oil down between decks and got ready for a gale

Friday Feb 6th 1846

Begins with a fresh gale from the SW and cloudy heading SSE employed in hauling saw the Phoenix M^o and latter fresh the same employed in stowing down finished boiling

Saturday Feb 7th 1846

Begins with gentle breeze from the SW and cloudy & a heavy swell employed in stowing down at night neared ship to the SE saw 1 ship M^o and latter fresh light air and calm Lat 35-39 Long 114 27

Sunday Feb 8th 1846

Begins with gentle breeze from the NW heading SW saw nothing at 1 neared ship to the NW at 6 to the SSE latter fresh gales and a heavy swell

Monday Feb 9th 1846

Begins with a fresh gale from the SW and squally heading SE at 5 PM neared ship to the W latter fresh headed SSE finished stowing down
Bar 30- Lat 34 47 S Long 114 20

Tuesday Feb 10th 1846

Begins with fresh breeze from the SSE and cloudy employed in getting out pipe shook for water heading WSW at night neared ship to the SE latter fresh fresh gales heading SSE
Bar 30- Lat 35-13 S Long 114 20

Wednesday Feb 11th 1846

Begins with strong gales from the SE heading SE at 8 PM neared ship to the SW M^o and latter fresh heading SSE employed in setting up shooks for water
Bar 30- Lat 35-29 S Long 114 20 E

Thursday Feb 12th 1846

Begins with fresh gales from the SSE and clear heading S saw nothing M^o part the same at 7 AM neared ship to the SE
Bar 29.75 Lat 36 07 S Long 114 50 E

Friday Feb 13th 1846

Begins with fresh breeze from the SSE and clear heading SE saw nothing some whales come once more into port we must go at 9 AM neared to the SSE at 3 AM to the SSE Lat 35-38 Long 114 60 E
Bar 29.75

Saturday Feb 14th 1846

Begins with strong gales from the SE heading SE at 7 AM neared ship to the S saw a Schooner steering NW M^o part the same at 1 PM neared to the SSE latter more moderate Lat 35 26 S Long 114 35 E
