Monday March 16th 1846

Begins with gentle breezes from the NW and clear steering NW. Saw and heard us some Whales. Mid and latter part wind W heading NW. Lat 31° 26' S Long 111° 10' E
Bar 29.75

Tuesday March 17th 1846

Begins with fresh breezes from the W and cloudy heading NW. Saw a Brig latter part light breezes from the SE. Steered WSW. Bar 29.75 Lat 30.10 S Long 110.30

Begins with gentle breezes from the S. Steered W. A heavy swell from the SW. Latter wind S. Steered NW. Bar 29.75

Lat 30.11 S Long 109.12

Thursday March 19th 1846

Begins with gentle breezes from the SE. Steered NW. At night headed N. Mid and latter wind NW heading W. Bar 29.75

Lat 28.42 S Long 108.12

Friday March 20th 1846

Begins with strong gales from the SW. Steered N. At night headed to the W. Latter wind S. A heavy swell steered N.

Lat 29.40 S Long 107.10 E

Bar 29.75 Saturday March 21st 1846

Begins with strong breezes from the SE. An cloudy steering SE. At night headed SE. Latter light wind S. on I haffling. Lat 28.57 S Long 108.00 E

Bar 29.75 Sunday March 22nd 1846

Begins with light haffling wind and cloudy heading to the NW. Saw Porpoises mid and latter all kinds of winds and weather.

Bar 29.75 Lat 28.42 S Long 107.24

Cruising for Whales

Monday March 23rd 1846

Begins with light wind from the W heading NW. No Whales to be seen. Omen - when shall we get home. Some Whales come. Mid and latter the same. Bar 29.75

Lat 28.14 S Long 108.15 E

Tuesday March 24th 1846

Begins with strong gales from the SW heading to the W. Saw nothing. Latter steered NW by W.

Bar 29.75 Lat 27.58 S Long 107.40

Wednesday March 25th 1846

Begins with strong breezes from the S and clear heading WSW. Mid and latter the same. At 11 AM veered ship to the S by S. Lat 27.50 S Long 106.45 E

Bar 30 - Thursday March 26th 1846

Begins with fresh breezes from the SE. on I heading SE. At 12 Mid veered ship to the SE. At 8 to the E. Lat 27.37 S Long 105.00 E

Bar 29.75 Friday March 27th 1846

Begins with strong breezes from the SE. on I cloudy heading SE. At 5 PM veered ship to the SW. Saw a ship to windward. At 5 AM veered ship to the E. Lat 28.26 S Long 107.40

Bar 29.75 Saturday March 28th 1846

Begins with gentle breeze from the SE. on I cloudy heading E. At 2 PM spoke the ship young Phoenix Michel of N Bedford. 16 1/2 months 450 bbls. Latter part light wind from SE. Steered N. E. Saw nothing. Other send us some whales.
