Sunday March 29th 1846

Begins with light breezes from the SW and sea heading N^W & at night headed W^{SW} latter part steered N^W & saw the young Phoenix

Bar 29th Lat 26 42 Long 107 20

Monday March 30th 1846

Begins with light breezes from the SW at 5 PM spoke the young Phoenix this part rainy latter steering E squally no whales

Bar 29th No Lat Long 108 35 - 2

Tuesday March 31st 1846

Begins with light airs from the SW and Sunday steering E latter fresh breezes from the W steering N^W & E

Bar 29th Lat 26 20 S Long 108 40

Wednesday April 1st 1846

Begins with fresh breezes from the W^{SW} and sea steering at night headed W^{SW} at 7 PM spoke ships to the SW latter steered E employed in painting

Boats saw nothing Lat 25 52 S Long 108 55

Bar 29th Thursday April 2nd 1846

Begins with light breezes from the SW and sea steering W at night headed W at 1 PM neared ships to the E latter steered E kept the old fore sail and repaired the other saw nothing

Bar 29th Lat 25 43 Long 109 00

Friday April 3rd 1846

Begins with light winds from the S and sea steering E latter same steered N^W & employed in repairing the main sail

Bar 29th

Lat 25 35 S Long 109 25 - 2

Looking for Whales

Saturday April 4th 1846

Begins with fresh breezes from the SW and some rain heading E saw jumpers & porpoises some whales some Odor Jan. Home sick at 12 Mid neared ship to the SW at 6 to the E Bar 29th Lat 25 48 Long 109 40 - 2

Sunday April 5th 1846

Begins with strong gales from the SW and squally heading E at 12 mid neared ship to the SW latter the same steered W Lat 26 46 Long 109 55

Bar 29th

Monday April 6th 1846

Begins with fresh gales from the SW heading SW at night neared ships to the E Odor when shall we get home at 6 PM neared to the SW latter the same Bar 29th Lat 26 16 Long 109 30

Tuesday April 7th 1846

Begins with strong breezes from the SW and sea heading SW at 6 PM neared ship to the E at day light to the SW at 10 AM saw a large whale going to the S quick down boat but could not catch him Lat 26 50 Long 109 30 - 2

Bar 29th

Wednesday April 8th 1846

Begins with gentle breezes from the SW and sea heading SW and day black latter headed to the SW at 11 AM taken to the E saw nothing

Bar 29th

Lat 25 21 S Long 108 55 - 2

Thursday April 9th 1846

Begins with gentle breezes from SW and cloudy heading E Mid and latter part the same Lat 26 57 S Long 109 30 - 2

Bar 29th

Home sick this day
No whales to be seen
