Begins with fresh breezes from the S and squally heading ESE. Mid and latter strong gales blowing from S. Lat 23 05 Long 109 00

Sunday June 14th 1846

Begins with a strong gale from the S heading ESE at 8 moved to the WSW at 8 am to the ESE. Lat 23 17 S Long 109 00
Bar 29.80

Monday June 15th 1846

Begins with fresh gales from the S heading ESE at 11 mid moved to the SW latter squally. Lat 23 25 S Long 109 30 E

Tuesday June 16th 1846

Begins with strong breezes from the SSE and clear heading E. O dear - What weather for whaling when shall we get home at 8 am moved to the SW saw nothing

Wednesday June 17th 1846

Begins with gales and squally heading SSW saw five backs latter more moderate heading SSE no whales to be seen

Begins with moderate breezes from the ESE heading NE at night moved to the S O dear - at 11 mid moved to the SE latter fine weather - no whales

Begins with gentle breezes from the ESE heading NE saw five backs. More new fore & main T sail & fore braces at day light taken to the S saw five backs

Begins with gentle breezes from the SSE at 8 am saw Whales at 4 lowered and struck two large whales at 4 took one to the ship at 8 took the other O Genl I thank thee for them latter fine weather employed in cutting. Lat 23 57 S

Sunday June 21st 1846

Begins with gentle breezes but in the two whales bodies and one head began to boil at 4 am put to from the head along side at 8 found it took it along side and cut it in

Monday June 22nd 1846

Begins with gentle trades heading SSW employed in hoisting Mid and latter the same moved ship to the ESE at 3 noon

Begins with fine weather heading ESE saw five backs. we are busy setting up casks and boiling Mid and latter put to the same

Lat 23 27 S Long 109 54

Wednesday June 24th 1846

Begins with fresh trades and clear heading ESE saw five backs finished looking at same latter the same fitting casks to stow

Lat 22 56 S Long 110 30 E

Thursday June 25th 1846

Begins with strong trades and clear heading ESE at 8 moved to the S latter blowing strong employed in stowing down oil

Friday June 26th 1846

Begins with a gale of wind employed in stowing down oil at 6 PM moved to the SE at day light to the SSE finished stowing the fore hole
