Begins with strong breeze from E S E and a heavy swell from the S W heading N E at 10 noon to the S latter fine weather finishes boiling saw fin backs lowered could not get past

Begins with gentle trader and clear heading S W at night veered to the E Mid and latter the same saw fin backs 3 ends my birth day Bar 2985 No Lat Long 110 10 E

Begins with fresh trader heading E N E at night tacked to the S W latter the same employed in stowing down Oil saw nothing all ready for more

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Friday July 3rd 1846

Begins with fresh trader and clear heading S W saw fin backs Mid and latter same at 8 AM veered ship and steered E N E to the N we must go Bar 2982 Lat 22 15 Long 109 35

Begins with strong gales from the S S E and cloudy steering E N E Mid first the same latter more moderate Bar 2980 Lat 21 55 S Long 110 25

Sunday July 5th 1846

Begins with gentle trader and clear heading E N E saw fin backs the ship has begun to leak a little god grant that it may be no worse latter first strong gales from E veered to S S E saw an abundance of fin backs Lat 21 31 S Long 111 10 E Bar 2990

Monday July 6th 1846

Begins with strong breezes from the E and clear heading S S E Mid first calm latter fresh gales from E N E heading S E Bar 2985 Lat 22 01 Long 111 40 E

Tuesday July 7th 1846

Begins with strong gales from E N E and clear at 6 PM veered ship to the N employed in varnishing the Cabin Come Whales Come at 3 to the S E Bar 2985 Lat 22 17 Long 111 40 E

Wednesday July 8th 1846

Begins with strong gales from the N E split the Main Top sail took it down & repaired it heading N W O clear - hot weather at 2 AM veered to the E S E at 10 AM to the N latter blowing a heavy gale and a bad sea Bar 2980 No Lat Long 111 13
