

Bark Draco of New Bedford

Friday August 14th 1846

Begins with fresh breezes from ESE
at 4 PM takes to the S & it is to the NE
latter same employed in repairing the
left top sail no whaler to be seen
Lat by Oh 1458 Long by Dist 118 20 of Chro 118 15

Saturday Aug 15th 1846

Begins with fresh breezes from ESE
heading S by E at 11 AM takes to the ENE
latter same whitewashing the Forecastle
Lat 1503 Long by Chro 118 35 of Dist 118 55
the Chro 20 miles to the W

Sunday Aug 16th 1846

Begins with gentle breezes from SE heading
ESE Mid and latter the same
Lat 1422 S Long 119 40 of Chro by Dist 119 54 E

Monday Aug 17th 1846

Begins with gentle trades heading from
ENE to NE at 1 PM sun - sprouts at
a dirt down boat but did not get near
enough to see what they were
Mid and latter part the same employed
in repairing old sails

Lat 1331 S Long 12100 E

Tuesday Aug 18th 1846

Begins with fresh trades heading ESE
sun - nothing at 8 takes to the S latter
steers NE Lat 1303 S Long 12150 E

Wednesday Aug 19th 1846

Begins with strong breezes from the ESE
steering NE at 4 PM steers NE
sun large tide rips Mid fair by clock
Lat Steers NE Lat 1158 Long 12215

Thursday Aug 20th 1846

Begins with strong gales from E steering
NE under double reefed top sail at 9 am
takes at 12 takes in latter same at 11 am sun
the side of Saver NE Lat 1053 S
Long 12215 E

in Timor Strait

Friday August 21st 1846

Begins with fresh trades heading NE
took in the jib and repaired at 3 PM
sun - Palo Teow Island having SE
at 6 PM bore SE Dist 15 miles sun
West 30 miles at 6 am to the S then port
sun - weather to the SE at noon 10 miles
Dist bent the cables

Lat 1030 S Long 12254 E

Saturday Aug 22nd 1846

Begins with fresh trades head NE
at 6 AM south end of Samar 2 but
12 miles at day light at end of Samar
2 miles Dist sun in for Coffang

Sun Day Aug 23rd 1846

Begins with a light sea breezes
at 2 PM came to anchor in 18
fathoms near the Fort SE 4 miles
found the Wm & Henry 10 months
300 Mercator - 9 months 40 on
an Eng Bark three Brothers 9 months
250

Tuesday Aug 25th 1846

Capt George Coffin of the English Bark
Brothers died at 6 PM was buried at
8 am with the gaudice

Thursday Sept 3rd 1846

Begins with fine weather - at 10 AM
took our anchor and took out of the
Bay in company with the Wm & Henry
of Jim Hoven left the young Phoenix
Mickell N B & Jalla Kookh So with 850
bbls each S ends bound for - Kelly
for - recruits
