Tuesday Oct 3rd 1846

Begins with strong trades steering SE at night headed E by N Carpenter says had he is delirious at times our boy down with the Venerial 15 years old
 Mio and latter the same Carpenter were better

Lat 13 36 S Long 111 32 E

Wednesday Oct 4th 1846

Begins with gentle trades heading E by N employed in fitting rigging & Mio and latter the same Lat 15 04 Long 112 10

Thursday Oct 5th 1846

Begins with gentle trades heading E by N at 11 am near to the SW saw Porpoises

Lat 13 36 Long 112 20

Friday Oct 6th 1846

Begins with gentle trade and no whales heading E by N Mio and latter the same saw a large body of five Barks

Lat 13 34 Long 112 40

Saturday Oct 7th 1846

Begins with gentle trades and clear heading E by N Mio and latter the same steering SE

Lat 12 57 Long 113 35

Sunday Oct 8th 1846

Begins with light trades steering NE at night headed E and headed aback latter steering NE

Lat 11 57 S Long 114 00 E

Monday Oct 12th 1846

Begins with light trades and very warm weather steering NE at night near to the SW Carpenter & the boy some better I send us some Whales give us patience to wait they time Mio and latter put the same

Lat 11 58

Tuesday Oct 13th 1846

Begins with fresh trades and cloudy heading SW saw nothing odor-odor for from friends and home Mio and latter put the same a heavy swell from the SW Lat 12 55 Long 112 00 E

Wednesday Oct 14th 1846

Begins with fresh trades and a heavy swell heading SW saw nothing Carpenter the boy Leavitt & Antonio V sick the two last with the Sympentery Mio and latter same

Lat 13 48 Long 110 50

Thursday Oct 15th 1846

Begins with gentle trades and no whales heading SW at night near to the E at 6 am to the SW

Lat 13 49 Long 110 10

Friday Oct 16th 1846

Begins with fresh trades heading SW at night near to ship to the E at 6 am to the SW Lat 13 58 S Long 109 40 E

Saturday Oct 17th 1846

Begins with fresh trades heading E by N no whales to be seen we must soon go from here to meet sick & with the Sympentery one with a fever & one with the Venerial latter headed SW saw jumpers
