Begins with gentle ESE trades and some squalls steering WNW all sail set to the best advantage Mid and latter the same

Lat 24 44 S Long 71 25 E

Saturday Nov 28th 1846

Begins with light trades from ESE and clear steering WNW Mid and latter same wind steering W steering sails both sides

Lat 24 46 S Long 69 36

Sunday Nov 29th 1846

Begins with gentle wind from E and clear steering W all sail Mid and latter fronts the same

Lat 25 03 S Long 69 25 E

Monday Nov 30th 1846

Begins with light breezes from the E steering WNW Mid and latter the same antonic no better the day varying

Lat 25 18 S Long 65 30 E

Tuesday Dec 1st 1846

Begins with light trades from the E steering WNW all sail Mid and latter the same

Lat 25 25 S Long 63 50 E

Wednesday Dec 2nd 1846

Begins with light breezes from ESE and clear steering WNW all sail Mid and latter clear wind

Lat 25 17 S Long 61 44 E

Thursday Dec 3rd 1846

Begins with light breezes from NW E and clear steering W Mid fronts squalls from the NW and calm latter light breezes from NE and clear

Lat 25 11 S Long 60 50 E

Friday Dec 4th 1846

Begins with light airs from the NE steering WNW Mid and latter the same a heavy swell from the SW

Lat 25 50 S Long 59 50 E

for - Madagascar

Saturday Dec 5th 1846

Begins with a light breeze from E and clear a heavy swell from the SW steering WNW we want some whales at 1 PM saw what we called sperm whales near the ship latter calm and squally

Lat 25 40 S Long 68 45 E

Sunday Dec 6th 1846

Begins with light breezes from E and clear steering WNW Mid and latter fronts the same

Lat 26 31 S Long 67 15 E

Monday Dec 7th 1846

Begins with gentle breezes from the ESE and squally steering WNW at 10 PM saw a brig heading to the N E Mid and latter the same

Lat 25 48 S Long 55 01 E

Tuesday Dec 8th 1846

Begins with with gentle breezes from ESE and cloudy steering WNW saw five Backs jumpers & Porpoises. 7 hump whales next Mid and latter fronts squally

Lat 25 08 S Long 52 50 E

Wednesday Dec 9th 1846

Begins with gentle breezes from E and squally steering WNW Mid and latter heavy squalls of rain

No Lat Long 50 50

Thursday Dec 10th 1846

Begins with gentle breezes steering NW at 1 PM spoke the English frigate British Sovereign from St. Francis for London at night shortened sail

Mid and latter same

Lat 24 51 S Long 48 00

Friday Dec 11th 1846

Begins with fresh breezes from NW and clear steering WNW at 6 PM saw Madagascar near Fort Dauphin bearing from W to NW bird coming took in sail heading NW at 9 PM passed the 2nd of the NW shoal in twilight so dark green water about 10 miles from the land
