all sail set Mr Robinson very sick but  
gaining M.D. and latter same

Wednesday March 3<sup>d</sup> 1847

Begins with fine weather employed  
in painting inside at 8 AM the Rev  
Charles Robinson <sup>aged 45 years</sup> departed this life  
after a long and lingering sickness Mr R.  
left his native home about 14 years since  
on a mission to preach the Gospel at Siem  
he has left a wife & 4 young children. It  
shows the loss of a good man his widow & family  
M.D.

Lat 9 00 S Long 74 20 W

Thursday March 4<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with fine weather at 4 PM took  
sail and buried Mr Robinson no one knows  
what an affecting sight it is to bury a man  
at sea who has been there that has seen it

latter the same Lat 7 35 S Long 74 00 W

Friday March 5<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with fine trades steering  
N by E M.D. and latter part the  
same same nothing

Lat 6 44 S Long 73 55 W

Saturday March 6<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with fresh trades and sea  
steering N by E all sail set M.D.  
and latter same Lat 5 04 S Long 72 00 W

Sunday March 7<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with fresh trades and cloudy  
steering N by E M.D. part squally  
latter clear

Lat 3 46 S Long 71 08 W

# Howell House

Monday March 8<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with fresh trades and sea  
steering N by E M.D. nothing M.D.  
the same a bark heading to the S at 10  
PM put M.D. sprawl in Irons and left  
him through the night for slenching the  
second mate order the sailors

Lat 2 35 S Long 75 20 W

Tuesday March 9<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with gentle trades and cloudy  
steering N by E M.D. and latter the same  
saw one sail Lat 1 39 S Long 76 30 W

Wednesday March 10<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with light trades steering N by E  
M.D. and latter same

Lat 1 17 S Long 76 35 of Ches 27 00

Thursday March 11<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with light air & calm sea - a bark  
heading N M.D. and latter baffling wind  
and rain at 10 PM spoke the boat  
Lucia Maria. Tuesday 25 days from  
Boston for Rio Janeiro via Cape

Friday March 12<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with squally weather and  
baffling wind steering N by E

Lat 15 N Long 77 11

Saturday March 13<sup>th</sup> 1847

All these 24 hours light baffling wind  
and heavy rain Lat 15 15 S Long 78 10 W

Sunday March 14<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with light air and calm M.D. and  
latter part the Lat 15 15 S Long 78 10 W

Monday March 15<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with light breezes from the S  
and cloudy same rain steering N by E  
M.D. and latter part heavy rain

Lat 15 15 S Long 79 15 W
