

Bay of Grace of New Bedford

Monday April 12th 1847

Begins with a strong gale from the seven
 heading W at 6 AM veered ship to the
 NNE more moderate set double reefed
 top sail Mid the same latter light airs
 and calm Lat 3450 N Long 70 06 W

Tuesday April 13th 1847

Begins with a fresh breeze from the
 S.W. and clear - steered N.W. all sail.
 saw 3 sails

Capt Coy has been home sick all day
 mid sent the same at 6 AM in the
 Gulf at 10 the wind hauled to the
 NNE cloudy weather saw a sail

Lat 3659 N Long 71 30 W

Wednesday April 14th 1847

Begins with a hard gale from the
 NNE heading NW took in sail and
 hove to at 5 PM air 54° Water 73°
 a bad sea Mid sent more moderate
 at 7 AM left the Gulf latter pleasant
 made all sail wind SE steered N.W.

Lat 3827 N Long 71 50 W

Thursday April 15th 1847

Begins with gentle breezes from the SE
 and clear - steered N discharged the
 try works saw a sail Mid the same
 latter calm at 10 AM sounded 42 fathoms
 sand latter Lat 40 13 N Long 71 50

Friday April 16th 1847

Begins with gentle breezes from the
 W and hoisted oblique N.E. at 4 PM
 spoke the Walpole of Boston 30 days from
 Liverpool for New York at 7 PM took a
 strong breeze from the W at 9 AM wind
 hauled to the W at 11 saw Gay Head to the
 N.E. at 12 took a Pilot run in for
 New Bedford so ends this voyage
