 and squally Bar 29.76 at 8 am the wind
 hauled to the S strong gales latter more
 moderate Lat 33 06 Long 30 10

Saturday Sept 25th 1847
 Begins with fresh gales from the
 S heading S.E. latter more
 moderate No Lat Long 28 30 W

Sunday Sept 26th 1847
 Begins with heavy Thunder and rainy
 wind S heading S.E.

Monday Sept 27th 1847

All these 24 hours heavy showers of rain
 wind S.W. heading S.E. Lat 32 32 Long 26 20

Wednesday Sept 29th 1847
 Begins with gentle breezes from the
 S.W. steering S.W. all sail
 Lat 29 28 Long 25 30

 by Dist 25 12

Friday Oct 1st 1847
 all these 24 hours fresh breezes

 Bar 29.51 Long 24 38 Lat 24 20

Saturday Oct 2^d 1847
 all these 24 strong trades and clear
 steering S by W employed in breaking
 out between decks
 Lat 22 54 N Long 24 45

Sunday Oct 3^d 1847
 Begins with strong trades steering
 S by W Mid and latter the same
 Lat 20 10 N Long 24 45 W

Monday Oct 4th 1847
 All these 24 hours strong trades
 steering S by W 8 5 all sail
 Lat 17 14 N Long 24 07

Tuesday Oct 5th 1847
 Begins with strong trades
 steering S by W at 4 P.M. saw
 St Nicholas bearing S.W. Dist
 15 miles Mid and latter parts
 running down for St Jago's at
 day light saw it at 11th took
 a squall from the S.W. and
 lost the trades so sailed
